1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ENHANCE LOCAL GOVERNMENT POWERS RELATIVE TO THE
3	ALCOHOL BEVERAGE CONTROL LAWS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 18B-104(a) reads as rewritten:
6	"(a) Penalties. – For any violation of the ABC laws, <u>a conviction of an offense set</u>
7	forth in Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, or a conviction of a felony, the Commission
8	may take any of the following actions against a permittee:
9	(1) Suspend the permittee's permit for a specified period of time not longer
10	than three years;
11	(2) Revoke the permittee's permit;
12	(3) Fine the permittee up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the first
13	violation, up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for the second
14	violation, and up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the third
15	violation; or
16	(4) Suspend the permittee's permit under subdivision (1) and impose a fine
17	under subdivision (3)."
18	Section 2. G.S. 18B-110 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
19	"(b) When the governing body of any municipality, or the mayor of the
20	municipality, upon delegation of authority from the governing body in the manner

1	(d) Commission's Authority. The Commission shall have the sole power, in its
2	discretion, to determine the suitability and qualifications of an applicant for a permit.
3	(a) Who Issues. – All ABC permits shall be issued by the Commission. Purchase-
4	transportation permits shall be issued by local boards under G.S. 18B-403.
5	(b) <u>Certificate of Suitability. – Before submitting an application for a retail ABC</u>
6	permit to the Commission, including an application for a temporary retail permit, the
7	applicant shall obtain a certificate of suitability from the municipality where the applicant
8	intends to locate his business stating that the municipality has determined that the
9	proposed location is a suitable place for an ABC permit. If the applicant does not intend
10	to locate his business within a municipality or its extraterritorial jurisdiction, the
11	applicant shall obtain the certificate of suitability from the governing body of the county
12	where his business is to be located. The following permits shall be exempted from this
13	section:
14	(1) Limited special occasion permit under G.S. 18B-1001(9);
15	(2) Special one-time permit under G.S. 18B-1002; or
16	(3) <u>All permits listed under G.S. 18B-1100.</u>
17	(b1) Factors in Issuing Certificate of Suitability To be a suitable place, the
18	establishment shall comply with all applicable building, fire, and zoning codes. Zoning
19	ordinances may restrict the places where permittees may operate, may require separation
20	or concentration of permitted locations, and may impose other reasonable restrictions or
21	conditions. The local governing body may also consider:
22	(1) The number of places already holding ABC permits within the
23	neighborhood;
24	(2) Parking facilities and traffic conditions in the neighborhood;
25	(3) Kinds of businesses already in the neighborhood;
26	(4) Whether the establishment is located within 50 feet of a church, public
27	school, daycare facility, or church school;
28	(5) Whether the proposed use will adversely impact on local government
29	services and facilities;
30	(6) Existing conditions in the neighborhood; and
31	(7) Whether operation of his business at that location would be detrimental
32	to the neighborhood. The applicant may enter into a binding agreement
33	with the local governing body to operate under certain conditions or
34	restrictions that will lessen the detriment to the neighborhood. Any
35	such agreement shall describe the consequences of a violation of the
36	<u>agreement.</u> (b2) Time Limit for Legal Covernment's Desigion The applicable legal coverning.
37	(b2) <u>Time Limit for Local Government's Decision. – The applicable local governing</u>
38	body or its designee shall grant or deny a certificate of suitability for a retail permit based
39 40	on written materials submitted to it by the applicant and others. The local body or designed shall make its decision on these written materials with 60 days after receiving an
40 41	designee shall make its decision on these written materials with 60 days after receiving an application for a certificate of suitability. If the local body or designee determines that
41 42	the location is not suitable, it shall state the reasons for its decisions. The local governing
42 43	body may appoint a person, board, commission, or other entity to carry out this function.
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1	(b3) Certificate of Suitability; Appeal. – An applicant may appeal for a hearing to
2	the local governing board or its designee. Appeal from this hearing shall be by certiorari
$\frac{2}{3}$	to Superior Court in the county in which the business is to be located. The provisions of
4	<u>Chapter 150B shall not apply to this section.</u>
5	(c) Factors in Issuing Permit. – No retail ABC permit shall be issued by the
6	<u>Commission without the applicant first obtaining a certificate of suitability. Before</u>
7	issuing a permit, the Commission shall also be satisfied that the applicant is a suitable
8	person to hold an ABC permit and that the premises is a suitable place to hold the permit
9	for which he has applied. Other factors the Commission shall consider in determining
10	whether the applicant and the business premises are suitable are:
11	(1) The reputation, character, and criminal record of the applicant;
12	(2) Any other evidence that would tend to show whether the applicant
12	would comply with the ABC laws; and
14	(3) Any other rules governing the licensed premises as defined by the
15	Commission.
16	(d) <u>Commission's Authority. – The Commission shall have the sole power, in its</u>
17	discretion, to determine the suitability and qualifications of an applicant for a permit.
18	(e) Local Government's Authority. – The applicable local governing body shall
19	have the sole power, in its discretion, to determine the suitability and qualifications of a
20	location for a retail permit. As part of this authority, local governments may issue, and
21	enforce the requirements of, special use permits or other similar zoning permits relating
22	to location of ABC permittees. Appeals of zoning regulations or special-use permits shall
23	be to superior court and shall be brought in the same manner that appeals of other zoning
24	actions or zoning permits are brought."
25	Section 4. G.S. 18B-902 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
26	"( <u>h</u> ) <u>A local governing body may charge a fee up to one hundred dollars (\$100.00)</u>
27	to applicants seeking a certificate of suitability."
28	Section 5. G.S. 18B-904(e) reads as rewritten:
29	"(e) Business or Location No Longer Suitable. – The Commission may suspend or
30	revoke a permit issued by it if, after compliance with the provisions of Chapter 150B of
31	the General Statutes, it finds that the location occupied by the permittee is no longer a
32	suitable place to hold ABC permits or that the operation of the business with an ABC
33	permit at that location is detrimental to the neighborhood. <u>A municipality or county may</u>
34	also commence a contested case under Chapter 150B to require the Commission to
35	revoke a permit on these grounds. No order revoking or suspending an ABC permit
36	pursuant to this section may be made except upon substantial evidence admissible under
37	G.S. 150B-29(a)."
38	Section 6. G.S. 18B-904(f) is repealed.
39	Section 7. Chapter 18B of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
40	section to read:
41	" <u>§ 18B-907. Delegation of local government powers.</u>

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- 1 <u>Every local governing body having duties under this Article for determining</u> 2 <u>suitability of retail locations may designate a local board, person, commission, or other</u>
- 3 <u>entity to exercise that authority.</u>"
