A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF
LOCATING A CLOSE CUSTODY PRISON FACILITY IN CLEVELAND
COUNTY.**

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Correction the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year to contract with a consultant to review the feasibility of locating one of the three new close custody facilities proposed for the State prison system in Cleveland County or of adding a facility in Cleveland County as a fourth close custody site. The feasibility study shall compare any proposed Cleveland County sites with sites currently under consideration in terms of land acquisition costs, water and sewer requirements, major road access, potential hiring pool, and any other pertinent criteria.

Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
