A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT CLEVELAND CORRECTIONAL CENTER SHALL
2 REMAIN OPEN.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. The General Assembly finds that Cleveland Correctional Center has
6 provided the State prison system with a site for the secure confinement of medium-
7 custody inmates in a cost-efficient manner, has provided a steady source of employment
8 for citizens of Cleveland and surrounding counties and has produced significant
9 economic benefits for those counties, and has developed a long-standing cooperative
10 relationship with Cleveland Community College for the provision of vocational education
11 programs to inmates.

12 Section 2. The Cleveland Correctional Center shall not be closed during the
13 1999-2001 biennium, but shall remain in operation as a medium-custody facility in the
14 State prison system.

15 Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
