April 12, 1999 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO SIMPLIFY THE LAW REGARDING STATE LEASES OF PROPERTY IN UNIQUE OR PREDETERMINED LOCATIONS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 146-32 reads as rewritten: "§ 146-32. Exemptions as to leases, etc. The Governor, acting with the approval of the Council of State, may adopt rules and regulations. Exempting from any or all of the requirements of this Subchapter such (1) classes of lease, rental, easement, and right-of-way transactions as he deems advisable: and Authorizing any State agency to enter into and/or approve those classes (2) of transactions exempted by such rules and regulations from the requirements of this Chapter. No rule or regulation adopted under this section may exempt from the (3) provisions of G.S. 146-25.1 any class of lease or rental which has a duration of more than 21 days, unless the class of lease or rental: Is a lease or rental necessitated by a fire, flood, or other disaster that forces the agency seeking the new lease or rental to cease
