Whereas, the General Assembly established, pursuant to Article 6C of

of the State Treasurer to be used to finance programs and initiatives to improve the health and wellness of the people in North Carolina; and

Whereas, moneys from the fund may be used to address the health needs of vulnerable and underserved populations in North Carolina; and

Whereas, the Health and Wellness Trust Fund Commission has the duty to develop criteria for awarding grants under the Article that will include programs addressing the short- and long-term health and wellness of the citizens of North Carolina; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. The Health and Wellness Trust Fund Commission shall, as it develops criteria for awarding grants under Article 6C of Chapter 147 of the General Statutes, include criteria that will enable programs and initiatives addressing the need to expand access to prescription drugs to North Carolina senior and disabled citizens to receive grants from the Fund. In making the grants, the Commission shall consider, and coordinate with, the availability of any federal funds allocated to North Carolina pursuant to any federal initiative to provide financial assistance to senior and disabled citizens for the cost of prescription drugs.

In making its annual report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and to the chairs of the Joint Legislative Health Care Oversight Committee regarding the implementation of the Article, the chair of the Health and Wellness Trust Fund Commission shall report on the programs and initiatives to expand access to prescription drugs to senior and disabled citizens that were funded by the Trust Fund. The report shall include the amount of funds disbursed for programs and initiatives to expand access to prescription drugs to senior and disabled citizens and the success of those programs and initiatives towards helping senior and disabled citizens obtain prescription drugs.

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
