A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR DIRECT PAYMENT OF REGISTERED NURSE FIRST
3	ASSISTANTS UNDER HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES AND PLANS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 58-50-30 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 58-50-30. Discrimination forbidden; right to choose services of optometrist,
 7 podiatrist, certified clinical social worker, certified substance abuse
 8 professional, dentist, chiropractor, psychologist, pharmacist, certified
 9 fee-based practicing pastoral counselor, advanced practice nurse,
 10 registered nurse first assistant, or physician assistant.

(a) Discrimination between individuals of the same class in the amount of
premiums or rates charged for any policy of insurance covered by Articles 50 through
55 of this Chapter, or in the benefits payable thereon, or in any of the terms or
conditions of such policy, or in any other manner whatsoever, is prohibited.

15 Whenever any policy of insurance governed by Articles 1 through 64 of this Chapter provides for payment of or reimbursement for any service rendered in connection with a 16 condition or complaint that is within the scope of practice of a duly licensed 17 18 optometrist, a duly licensed podiatrist, a duly licensed dentist, a duly licensed chiropractor, a duly certified clinical social worker, a duly certified substance abuse 19 professional, a duly licensed psychologist, a duly licensed pharmacist, a duly certified 20 21 fee-based practicing pastoral counselor, a duly licensed physician assistant, registered 22 nurse first assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse, the insured or other 23 persons entitled to benefits under the policy shall be entitled to payment of or 24 reimbursement for the services, whether the services be performed by a duly licensed physician, a duly licensed physician assistant, a duly licensed optometrist, a duly 25 26 licensed podiatrist, a duly licensed dentist, a duly licensed chiropractor, a duly certified 27 clinical social worker, a duly certified substance abuse professional, a duly licensed 28 psychologist, a duly licensed pharmacist, a duly certified fee-based practicing pastoral

1 counselor, a registered nurse first assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse, 2 notwithstanding any provision contained in the policy. Whenever any policy of 3 insurance governed by Articles 1 through 64 of this Chapter provides for certification of 4 disability that is within the scope of practice of a duly licensed physician, a duly 5 licensed physician assistant, a duly licensed optometrist, a duly licensed podiatrist, a 6 duly licensed dentist, a duly licensed chiropractor, a duly certified clinical social worker, a duly certified substance abuse professional, a duly licensed psychologist, a 7 8 duly certified fee-based practicing pastoral counselor, registered nurse first assistant, or 9 an advanced practice registered nurse, the insured or other persons entitled to benefits 10 under the policy shall be entitled to payment of or reimbursement for the disability 11 whether the disability be certified by a duly licensed physician, a duly licensed 12 physician assistant, a duly licensed optometrist, a duly licensed podiatrist, a duly licensed dentist, a duly licensed chiropractor, a duly certified clinical social worker, a 13 duly certified substance abuse professional, a duly licensed psychologist, a duly 14 15 certified fee-based practicing pastoral counselor, registered nurse first assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse, notwithstanding any provisions contained in the 16 policy. The policyholder, insured, or beneficiary shall have the right to choose the 17 provider of the services notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in any other 18 19 statute.

Whenever any policy of insurance provides coverage for medically necessary treatment, the insurer shall not impose any limitation on treatment or levels of coverage if performed by a duly licensed chiropractor acting within the scope of the chiropractor's practice as defined in G.S. 90-151 unless a comparable limitation is imposed on the medically necessary treatment if performed or authorized by any other duly licensed physician.

26 For the purposes of this section, a "duly licensed psychologist" shall be (b) defined only to include a psychologist who is duly licensed in the State of North 27 Carolina and has a doctorate degree in psychology and at least two years clinical 28 29 experience in a recognized health setting, or has met the standards of the National 30 Register of Health Service Providers in Psychology. After January 1, 1995, a duly licensed psychologist shall be defined as a licensed psychologist who holds permanent 31 32 licensure and certification as a health services provider psychologist issued by the North 33 Carolina Psychology Board.

(c) For the purposes of this section, a "duly certified clinical social worker" is a
"certified clinical social worker" as defined in G.S. 90B-3(2) and certified by the North
Carolina Certification Board for Social Work pursuant to Chapter 90B of the General
Statutes.

(c1) For purposes of this section, a "duly certified fee-based practicing pastoral
counselor" shall be defined only to include fee-based practicing pastoral counselors
certified by the North Carolina State Board of Examiners of Fee-Based Practicing
Pastoral Counselors pursuant to Article 26 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

42 (c2) For purposes of this section, a "duly certified substance abuse professional" is
43 a person certified by the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Certification
44 Board pursuant to Article 5C of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

1 (f) Payment or reimbursement is required by this section for a service performed 2 by a duly licensed physician assistant only when: 3 (1)The service performed is within the lawful scope of practice of the physician assistant in accordance with rules adopted by the North 4 5 Carolina Medical Board pursuant to G.S. 90-18.1; 6 The policy currently provides reimbursement for identical services (2)7 performed by other licensed health care providers; and 8 (3) The reimbursement is made to the physician, clinic, agency, or 9 institution employing the physician assistant. Nothing in this subsection is intended to authorize payment to more than one provider 10 11 for the same service. For the purposes of this section, a "duly licensed physician 12 assistant" is a physician assistant as defined by G.S. 90-18.1." SECTION 2.(a) G.S. 58-65-1(a) reads as rewritten: 13 14 "§ 58-65-1. Regulation and definitions; application of other laws; profit and 15 foreign corporations prohibited. Any corporation heretofore or hereafter organized under the general 16 (a) corporation laws of the State of North Carolina for the purpose of maintaining and 17 operating a nonprofit hospital and/or medical and/or dental service plan whereby 18 hospital care and/or medical and/or dental service may be provided in whole or in part 19 20 by said corporation or by hospitals and/or physicians and/or dentists participating in such plan, or plans, shall be governed by this Article and Article 66 of this Chapter and 21 shall be exempt from all other provisions of the insurance laws of this State, heretofore 22 enacted, unless specifically designated herein, and no laws hereafter enacted shall apply 23 24 to them unless they be expressly designated therein. 25 The term "hospital service plan" as used in this Article and Article 66 of this Chapter includes the contracting for certain fees for, or furnishing of, hospital care, laboratory 26 facilities, X-ray facilities, drugs, appliances, anesthesia, nursing care, operating and 27 28 obstetrical equipment, accommodations and/or any and all other services authorized or 29 permitted to be furnished by a hospital under the laws of the State of North Carolina and 30 approved by the North Carolina Hospital Association and/or the American Medical Association. 31 32 The term "medical service plan" as used in this Article and Article 66 of this Chapter 33 includes the contracting for the payment of fees toward, or furnishing of, medical, 34 obstetrical, surgical and/or any other professional services authorized or permitted to be 35 furnished by a duly licensed physician, except that in any plan in any policy of insurance governed by this Article and Article 66 of this Chapter that includes services 36 which are within the scope of practice of a duly licensed optometrist, a duly licensed 37 38 chiropractor, a duly licensed psychologist, a duly licensed pharmacist, a registered nurse first assistant, an advanced practice registered nurse, a duly certified clinical social 39 worker, a duly certified substance abuse professional, a duly certified fee-based 40 41 practicing pastoral counselor, a duly licensed physician assistant, and a duly licensed physician, then the insured or beneficiary shall have the right to choose the provider of 42 43 the care or service, and shall be entitled to payment of or reimbursement for such care or service, whether the provider be a duly licensed optometrist, a duly licensed 44

1	chiropractor, a duly licensed psychologist, a duly licensed pharmacist, <u>a registered nurse</u>			
2	first assistant, an advanced practice registered nurse, a duly certified clinical social			
3	worker, a duly certified substance abuse professional, a duly certified fee-based

9	General Statutes."			
10	SECTION 2.(b) G.S. 58-65-1 is amended by adding the following new			
11	subsection to read:			
12	"(c1) For purposes of this section, a "registered nurse first assistant" is a person			
13	who:			
14	(1) Is licensed as a registered nurse in this State,			
15	<u>a.</u> Is certified in perioperative nursing, and			
16	b. <u>Has successfully completed a registered nurse first assistant</u>			
17	education program that meets the Association of Perioperative			
18	Registered Nurses, Inc.'s education standard for the registered			
19	nurse first assistant; or			
20	(2) Was holding the title of and practicing as a registered nurse first			
21	assistant as of January 1, 1993.			
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25	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2001, and applies to			
26	claims for payment or reimbursement for services rendered on or after that date.
