1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE NORTH CAROLINA CONSTITUTION TO
3	RECOGNIZE THE RIGHT TO HEALTH CARE.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Article I of the North Carolina Constitution is amended by
6	adding a new section to read:
7	"Sec. 38. Health care.
8	Health care is an essential safeguard of human life and dignity, and there is an
9	obligation for the State to ensure that every resident is able to realize this fundamental
10	right. Not later than July 1, 2004, the General Assembly shall provide by law a plan to
11	ensure that by July 1, 2008, every resident of North Carolina has access to appropriate
12	health care on a regular basis."
13	SECTION 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be
14	submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the general election in November 2001,
15	which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State.
16	Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the
17	General Statutes. The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall be:
18	"[]FOR []AGAINST
19	Constitutional amendment providing that health care is a fundamental right."
20	<b>SECTION 3.</b> If a majority of the votes cast on the question are in favor of
21	the amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify
22	the amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the
23	amendment so certified among the permanent records of that office.
24	SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State
25	Board of Elections the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the 2001-2002
26	fiscal year to implement this act.
27	<b>SECTION 5.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
