15	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-79.7 reads as rewritten:

16 "§ 20-79.7. Fees for special registration plates and distribution of the fees.

(a) Fees. – Upon request, the Division shall provide and issue free of charge one
registration plate to a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor, a 100% disabled
veteran, and an ex-prisoner of war. All other special registration plates, including
additional Congressional Medal of Honor, 100% Disabled Veteran, and Ex-Prisoner of
War plates, are subject to the regular motor vehicle registration fee in G.S. 20-87 or
G.S. 20-88 plus an additional fee in the following amount:

1	a.	Thirty-three percent (33%) to the account of the Department of
2		Commerce to aid in financing out-of-state print and other media
3		advertising under the program for the promotion of travel and
4		industrial development in this State.
5	b.	Fifty percent (50%) to the Department of Transportation to be
6		used solely for the purpose of beautification of highways other
7		than those designated as interstate. These funds shall be
8		administered by the Department of Transportation for
9		beautification purposes not inconsistent with good landscaping
10		and engineering principles.
11	с.	Seventeen percent (17%) to the account of the Department of
12		Health and Human Services to promote travel accessibility for
13		disabled persons in this State. These funds shall be used to
14		collect and update site information on travel attractions
15		designated by the Department of Commerce in its publications,
16		to provide technical assistance to travel attractions concerning
17		accommodation of disabled tourists, and to develop, print, and
18		promote the publication ACCESS NORTH CAROLINA as
19		provided in G.S. 168-2. Any funds allocated for these purposes
20		that are neither spent nor obligated at the end of the fiscal year
21		shall be transferred to the Department of Administration for
22		removal of man-made barriers to disabled travelers at
23		State-funded travel attractions. Guidelines for the removal of
24		man-made barriers shall be developed in consultation with the
25		Department of Health and Human Services."
26	SECTION 3	• This act is effective when it becomes law.
