A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE MEMORY OF CHIANG CHING-KUO, LATE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA ON TAIWAN, AND EXPRESSING THE BELIEF THAT THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA ON TAIWAN (ROC) SHOULD BE PERMITTED TO PARTICIPATE IN A MEANINGFUL AND APPROPRIATE WAY IN THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION.

Whereas, good health is essential to every citizen of the world; and

Whereas, access to the highest standards of health information and services is necessary to improve public health; and

Whereas, direct and unobstructed participation in international health forums and programs is critical, especially with today's greater potential for the cross-border spread of various infectious diseases such as the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), tuberculosis, and malaria; and

Whereas, one of the World Health Organization's (WHO) objectives is to attain the highest possible level of health for all people; and

Whereas, the Republic of China on Taiwan's achievements in the field of health are substantial, including attaining one of the highest life expectancy levels in Asia, achieving maternal and infant mortality rates comparable to those of western countries, eradicating such infectious diseases as cholera, smallpox, and the plague, being the first to eradicate polio, and providing children with hepatitis B vaccinations; and

Whereas, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and its ROC counterpart have enjoyed close collaboration on a wide range of public health issues; and

Whereas, in recent years the ROC has expressed a willingness to assist financially and technically international aid and health activities supported by the WHO; and

Whereas, the ROC's population of twenty-three million is larger than that of seventy-five percent of the WHO member states; and

1	Whereas, the World Health Assembly of the WHO has allowed observers to
2	participate in the activities of the organization, including the Palestine Liberation
3	Organization in 1974, the Order of Malta, and the Holy See in the early 1950s; and
4	Whereas, the United States, in the 1994 Taiwan Policy review, declared its

Whereas, the United States, in the 1994 Taiwan Policy review, declared its intention to support the ROC's participation in appropriate international organizations; and

Whereas, the ROC's participation in the WHO could bring many benefits to the state of health not only in the ROC, but also regionally and globally; Now, therefore, Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:

SECTION 1. The General Assembly honors the life and memory of Chiang Ching-kuo, former President of the Republic of China on Taiwan, whose policies helped accelerate democracy in the Republic of China on Taiwan.

SECTION 2. The General Assembly expresses its belief that the Republic of China on Taiwan should be permitted to participate in a meaningful and appropriate way in the World Health Organization.

SECTION 3. The Secretary of State shall transmit a certified copy of this resolution to President George W. Bush, Governor Michael F. Easley, the World Health Organization, and Ms. Maggie Tien, Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Atlanta.

SECTION 4. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
