A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT IT IS A FELONY TO POSSESS, PASS, OR UTTER
COUNTERFEIT UNITED STATES CURRENCY WITH THE INTENT TO DEFRAUD ANOTHER.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 5 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-13.1. Possess, utter, or pass counterfeit United States currency with an intent to defraud another.

- (a) Any person who, knowingly and with the intent to defraud, utters, or passes counterfeit United States currency is guilty of a Class I felony.
- (b) Any person who knowingly possesses counterfeit United States currency is guilty of a Class I felony.
- (c) Any person who attempts to commit a violation of subsection (a) or (b) of this section or who aids or abets another person in violating subsection (a) or (b) of this section is guilty of a Class I felony."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2001, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
