LEE QUALITY JOBS AND BUSINESS EXPANSION ACT. 4 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study the impact 6 7 and equity of the William S. Lee Quality Jobs and Business Expansion Act. This study 8 shall include the following: 9 Reexamining the formula in G.S. 105-129.3(b) used to define (1) 10 enterprise tiers, including consideration of alternative measures of designating tiers for more equitable treatment of counties in similar 11 12 economic circumstances. 13 Considering whether the assignment of tiers and the applicable (2) thresholds are equitable for smaller counties. 14 15 Compiling any available data on whether expanding North Carolina (3) businesses receive fewer benefits than out-of-state businesses that 16 17 locate to North Carolina. 18 Study of the distribution of tax incentives across new and expanding (4) 19 industries and among counties. 20 Examination of data on economic recruitment for the period 1994 (5) 21 through the present by county, by industry type, by size of investment, and by number of jobs, and other relevant information to determine the 22

enactment of the William S. Lee Act incentives.
