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1	(10) Four persons representing agricultural interests, two to be appointed by		
2	the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and two to be appointed by		
3	the Speaker of the House of Representatives.		
4	The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of		
5	Representatives shall each designate a cochair from the General Assembly membership		
6	serving on the Commission. The Commission shall meet upon the call of the cochairs. A		
7	majority of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.		
8	SECTION 2. The Commission shall examine the availability and use of		
9	alternative energy sources in North Carolina, including the use of biomass resources.		
10	The Commission shall gather data and other information as may be necessary to		
11	accomplish the purposes of the Commission and shall work cooperatively with other		
12	boards, commissions, and entities, taking advantage of their resources and activities for		
13	the provision of useful information and insight. In the course of its study, the		
14	Commission may seek input and advice from the North Carolina Utilities Commission,		
15	the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, the North		
16	Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, the Attorney General, and		
17	the Public Staff of the Utilities Commission. The Commission may also review		
18	alternative energy activities conducted in other states.		
19	In the course of its study and in making its recommendations, the		
20	Commission may consider the following subjects:		
21	(1) Methods to encourage the use of alternative energy sources, such as		
22	tax incentives, alternative energy portfolio standards, system benefit		
23	programs, and product offerings to retail electricity customers.		
24	(2) Barriers to distribution and market entry for alternative energy		
25	generators.		
26	(3) Federal and State regulatory jurisdiction with respect to electric		
27	utilities, including potential conflicts and ways to address those		
28	conflicts.		
29	(4) Environmental benefits and impacts associated with alternative energy		
30	generation.		
31	(5) Assurance of fairness and equity among all electricity customer classes		
32	and electric power providers.		
33	(6) Potential benefits to rural areas of the State and to agricultural		
34	economic development.		
35	(7) Other relevant and appropriate subjects, as determined by the		
36	Commission.		
37	SECTION 3. Upon approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the		
38	Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist in the		
39 40	work of the Commission. Clerical staff shall be furnished to the Commission through the officer of the House of Depresentatives and Senate Supervisors of Clerks. The		
40	the offices of the House of Representatives and Senate Supervisors of Clerks. The		
41	Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building		

upon the approval of the Legislative Services Commission.

1	Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel
2	allowances as follows:
3	(1) Commission members who are members of the General Assembly at
4	the rate established in G.S. 120-3.1.
5	(2) Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or of
6	local government agencies at the rate established in G.S. 138-6.
7	(3) All other Commission members at the rate established in G.S. 138-5.
8	SECTION 4. The Commission may report its findings and
9	recommendations, if any, to the 2002 Regular Session of the 2001 General Assembly.
10	The Commission shall report its findings and recommendations, if any, to the 2003
11	General Assembly. Upon filing its report to the 2003 General Assembly, the
12	Commission shall terminate.
13	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated to the General Assembly, the
14	Legislative Services Commission may allocate up to twenty-five thousand dollars
15	(\$25,000) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and up to twenty-five thousand dollars
16	(\$25,000) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year for the expenses of the Commission.
17	SECTION 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.
