A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO AMEND THE PROHIBITION AGAINST HUNTING FROM THE RIGHT-OF-WAY IN HARNETT COUNTY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** Section 1 of S.L. 1997-103 reads as rewritten:

"Section 1. It is unlawful to hunt, take, or kill, with a firearm or other deadly weapon, or to attempt to hunt, take, or kill, with a firearm or other deadly weapon, any wild animal or wild bird hunt with a loaded firearm, including center-fire rifles, shotguns, or pistols with barrel lengths greater than five and one-half inches on, from, or across the right-of-way of any public road, street, highway, or thoroughfare. For purposes of this section, "loaded firearm" means a firearm with shells in the chamber magazine or clip.

It is prima facie evidence of a violation of this section to possess a loaded firearm outside of a vehicle on the roadway or right-of-way of a public road."

**SECTION 2.** Section 5 of S.L. 1997-103 reads as rewritten:

- "Section 5. Violation of Section 1 or 2 of this act is a Class 3 misdemeanor. misdemeanor punishable as follows:
  - (1) For a first conviction, by a fine of not less than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or by 30 days' imprisonment;
  - (2) For a second conviction within three years, by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) nor more than seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) and the suspension of the defendant's hunting license for one year following conviction, or by 30 days' imprisonment; or
  - (3) For a third conviction within three years, by a fine of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) and the suspension of the defendant's hunting license for three years following conviction, or by 60 days' imprisonment."
  - **SECTION 3.** This act applies only to Harnett County.
- SECTION 4. This act becomes effective October 1, 2002.
