2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE AGRICULTURAL FAIRS ADVISORY COUNCIL
3	AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR GRANTS FOR LOCAL
4	AGRICULTURAL FAIRS.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Part 4 of Article 45 of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes is
7	amended by adding a new section to read:
8	" <u>§ 106-520.8. Agricultural Fairs Advisory Council.</u>
9	The Agricultural Fairs Advisory Council is created. The Commissioner of
10	Agriculture may appoint the members of the Agricultural Fairs Advisory Council. The
11	Advisory Council may consist of up to 15 members, who shall represent local and
12	county agricultural fairs, commodity associations, farm organizations, or persons having
13	an interest in agricultural fairs. The members of the Agricultural Fairs Advisory Council
14	shall serve at the pleasure of the Commissioner of Agriculture. The Commissioner or
15	the Commissioner's designee shall serve as Cochair of the Advisory Council. The
16	Advisory Council shall meet at the call of the Cochair for the purpose of advising the
17	Commissioner of Agriculture on the distribution of grants to local agricultural fairs
18	licensed under this Article from funds appropriated by the General Assembly for this
19	purpose."
20	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
21	Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services the sum of three hundred thousand
22	dollars (\$300,000) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year to be used for grants to local
23	agricultural fairs licensed under Article 45 of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes and to
24	be distributed by the Commissioner of Agriculture. The Commissioner of Agriculture
25	may seek advice on the distribution of these grants from the Agricultural Fairs Advisory
26	Council, created in G.S. 106-520.8, as enacted in Section 1 of this act.
27	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
