Counterfeiting of instruments. 8 The following definitions apply in this section: (a) Counterfeited. – A document that purports to be genuine, but is not, 9 (1) because it has been falsely made, manufactured, embossed, encoded, 10 duplicated, or altered. 11 Instrument. – Defined in G.S. 25-3-104. 12 (2) Any person who makes, manufactures, buys, sells, exchanges, transfers, 13 (b) tenders, or receives a counterfeited instrument with the intent that the same be passed or 14 used as true and genuine shall be guilty of a Class H felony. 15 Any person with the intent to defraud who transports in interstate commerce 16 or possesses three or more counterfeited instruments shall be guilty of a Class G 17 18 felony." 19 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2001, and applies to
