**BILL SUMMARY:** House Bill 162 (3<sup>rd</sup> Edition) To allow counties to establish the rates set for adult day care services funded through the Home and Community Care Block Grant.

**ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:**

Allowing counties to establish rates for adult day services would result in a *variation of rates* across the state, but would not increase the amount of funds appropriated in the Home and Community Care Block Grant. Increases in adult day services rates would not change any county's allocation of block grant funding. However, if a county chooses to increase the rate established for adult day services, *the amount or mix of services provided* with block grant funding in that particular county would change.
