S 623. IT GAP ANALYSIS/"HACK ATTACK" (NEW). Intro. 4/1/03. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Replaces blank bill with new GS 147-33.82(e1) requiring that State Chief Information Officer evaluate each state agency's ability to comply with security enterprise-wide standards and determine the cost of full compliance with those standards. Officer and Information Resources Management Comm'n shall submit results of evaluation to Jt. Legis. Comm'n on Governmental Operations by May 4, 2004, and by Jan. 15 of each subsequent year.

S 623. DOWNTOWN ADULT RESIDENTIAL FACILITY (NEW). Intro. 4/1/03. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Replaces existing bill with a completely new bill. SL 1997-443, sec. 11.69(b), placed a moratorium on the Dep't of Health and Human Services approval of additional adult care home beds, but granted an exemption to entities which had submitted a plan for approval prior to May 18, 1997, and had entered into a real estate contract to purchase or lease real property for the purpose of building an adult care home facility. SL 2001-234, sec. 3, amended SL 1997-443, sec. 11.69, by adding subsection (b1), removing that exemption unless documentation of the construction of the facility was provided on or before Dec. 1, 2002, and a certificate of occupancy was issued prior to Dec. 1, 2003. SL 2001-234, sec. 3 also enacted subsection (b2), which provided that notwithstanding the requirements of subsection (b1), an entity that had previously obtained an exemption under subsection (b) for the construction of a new building that was not connected to any existing structure, and had obligated various "Qualifying Financial Commitments" for the construction of the building of \$25,000 or more before Jan. 1, 2001, could proceed to develop the beds and obtain a license for the operation of the beds. However, subsection (b2) required that entities provide DHHS with loan closing documents on or before June 1, 2004, evidence that the foundation and footing of the facility have been completed on or before Dec. 1, 2004, and a copy of the certificate of occupancy of the building on or before Dec. 1, 2005. Act extends the first two deadlines by one year for "specially impacted adult care homes," defined as those that are ten stories or more in height, and are located within the boundaries of a municipal service district, within 100 yards of a mixed-use building of more than 10 stories, and within 100 yards of an office building that is more than 20 stories in height.
