	SECTION 1. Article 7 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a n	ew section to read:
" <u>§ 14-27.1</u>	5. Sexual battery.
<u>(a)</u>	Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:
	(1) 'Intimate parts' means the genital area, groin, anus, inner thighs,
	buttocks, or breasts.
	(2) 'Sexual contact' means any contact by a defendant with the intimate
	parts of a person not married to the defendant for the purpose of sexual
	gratification of the defendant or for the purpose of degrading or
	humiliating the person or any contact by a defendant of the intimate
	parts of the defendant with a person not married to the defendant for
	the purpose of sexual gratification of the defendant or for the purpose
	of degrading or humiliating the person.
	Offense. – A defendant commits the offense of sexual battery if the defendant
	ly subjects another person to sexual contact.
	Penalty. – A defendant convicted of a first offense under this section is guilty
	A1 misdemeanor. A defendant convicted of a second or subsequent offense
under this section is guilty of a Class I felony."	

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to

offenses committed on or after that date.
