(b) A person commits the offense of habitual misdemeanor larceny if that person		
is 18 years of age or older, commits misdemeanor larceny under G.S. 14-72(a), and has		
been convicted of five or more prior misdemeanor larceny convictions. A person		
convicted of	violating this section is guilty of a Class H felony.	

For purposes of this section, if an offender is convicted of more than one

offense of misdemeanor larceny in a single session of district court, or in a single week

- of superior court or of a court in another jurisdiction, only one of the convictions may be used to establish the offense of habitual misdemeanor larceny."
- SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
