April 10, 2003 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT AMENDING THE EXECUTIVE BUDGET ACT TO PROVIDE 3 FLEXIBILITY IN BUDGETING FOR THE STATE'S INFORMATION 4 TECHNOLOGY NEEDS. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 143-23(a2) reads as rewritten: 6 7 "(a2) Funds appropriated for salaries and wages are also subject to the limitation 8 that they may only be used for: 9 (1) Salaries and wages or for premium pay, overtime pay, longevity, unemployment compensation, workers' compensation, temporary 10 11 wages, moving expenses of employees, payment of accumulated 12 annual leave, certain awards to employees, tort claims, and employer's 13 social security, retirement, and hospitalization payments; 14 (2) Contracted personal services if (i) the contract is for temporary services or special project services, (ii) the term of the contract does 15 16 not extend beyond the fiscal year, (iii) the contract does not impose 17 obligations on the State after the end of the fiscal year; and (iv) the total of all overexpenditures for contracted personal services approved 18 in a program for a fiscal year does not exceed the greater of five 19 hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) or ten percent (10%) of the 20 lapsed salary funds in the program for the fiscal year; and 21 22 Uses for which overexpenditures are permitted by subdivision (2) of (3) subsection (a1) of this section but the Director of the Budget shall 23 include such use and the reason for it in his quarterly report to the Joint 24 25

- Information technology expenditures if (i) there is a critical need for (4) the expenditure as determined by the Office of State Budget and Management in consultation with the State Chief Information Officer,

1	(ii) the expenditure will be fully funded for the fiscal year, and (iii) the
2	expenditure will not continue into the next fiscal year."
3	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.
