1	institution would require a substantial increase in funds, State Board approval shall be
2	subject to appropriation of funds by the General Assembly for this purpose.
3	(c) Addition of the bachelors degree program shall not decrease an institution's
4	ability to provide programs within its basic mission of vocational and technical training
5	and basic academic education.
6	(d) The State Board of Community Colleges shall develop appropriate criteria
7	and standards to regulate the addition of the bachelors degree program to institutions.
8	(e) The State Board of Community Colleges shall develop appropriate criteria
9	and standards to regulate the operation of bachelors degree programs. The criteria and
10	standards shall require all bachelors degree programs to continue to meet the
11	accreditation standards of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
12	The State Board of Community Colleges shall report annually to the General
13	Assembly on compliance of the community colleges with these criteria and standards."
14	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2003.
