6	SECT	<b>TON 1.</b> G.S. 75B-1 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 75B-1. Defin	itions.
8	The followin	g words and phrases as used in this Chapter shall have the following
9	meaning unless	the context clearly requires otherwise:
10	(1)	"Business," the manufacture, processing, sale, purchase, licensing,
11		distribution, provision, or advertising of goods or services, or
12		extension of credit, or issuance of letters of credit, or any other aspect
13		of business;
14	<u>(1a)</u>	"Commercial customer," a business entity that procures or attempts to
15		procure goods or services, including construction, real estate
16		development, financial, insurance, professional and other services,
17		from persons for business as opposed to personal use;
18	(2)	"Foreign government," all governments and political subdivisions and
19		the instrumentalities thereof, excepting the government, political
20		subdivisions, and instrumentalities of the United States and the states,
21		commonwealths, territories and possessions of the United States, and
22		the District of Columbia;
23	(3)	"Foreign person," any person whose principal place of residence,
24		business or domicile is outside the United States, or any person
25		controlled directly or indirectly by such person or persons; provided,
26		however, that no person shall be deemed a foreign person if after
27		reasonable inquiry and due diligence it cannot be determined that any

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1		such person has a principal place of residence, business, or domicile
2		outside the United States or is controlled by such person;
3	(4)	"Foreign trade relationships," the dealing with or in any foreign
4		country of any person, or being listed on a boycott list or compilation
5		of unacceptable persons maintained by a foreign government, foreign
6		person, or international organization;
7	(5)	"International organization," any association or organization, with the
8		exception of labor associations, or organizations of which more than a
9		majority of the membership consists of foreign persons or foreign
10		governments; and
11	(6)	"Persons," one or more of the following or their agents, employees,
12		servants, representatives, directors, officers, partners, members,
13		managers, superintendents, and legal representatives: individuals,
14		corporations, partnerships, joint ventures, associations, labor
15		organizations, educational institutions, mutual companies, joint-stock
16		companies, trusts, unincorporated organizations, trustees, trustees in
17		bankruptcy, receivers, fiduciaries, and all other entities recognized at
18		law by this State."
19	SECT	<b>FION 2.</b> G.S. 75B-2 reads as rewritten:
20	"§ 75B-2. Disci	rimination in business prohibited.
21		Il be unlawful for any person doing business in the State or for any
22	agency, institution	on or political subdivision of the State of North Carolina:
23	(1)	To enter into any agreement, contract, arrangement, combination, or
24		understanding with any foreign government, foreign person, or
25		international organization, which requires such person or the State to
26		refuse, fail, or cease to do business in the State with any other person
27		who is domiciled or has a usual place of business in the State, based
28		upon such other person's race, color, creedgender, religion, sex,
29		national origin origin, age, physical disability or foreign trade
30		relationships;
31	(2)	To execute in the State any contract with any foreign government,
32		foreign person, or international organization which requires such
33		person or the State to refuse, fail or cease to do business with another
34		person who is domiciled or has a usual place of business in the State,
35		based upon such other person's race, color, creed, gender, religion, sex,
36		national origin, age, physical disability or foreign trade relationships;
37	(3)	To refuse, fail or cease to do business in the State with any other
38		person who is domiciled or has a usual place of business in the State or
39		with the State when such refusal, failure, or cessation results directly
40		or indirectly from an agreement, contract, arrangement, combination,
41		or understanding between the person who refuses, fails or ceases to do
42		business and any foreign government, foreign person, or international
43		organization, and is based upon such other person's race, color,

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1	<del>creed, gender,</del> religion, sex, national origin origin, age, physical
2	disability or foreign trade relationships;
3	(4) To discharge or to fail, refuse or cease to hire, promote or appoint in
4	the State any other person who is domiciled in the State to any position
5	of employment or employment responsibility when such refusal,
6	failure or cessation results from an agreement, contract, arrangement,
7	combination, or understanding with any foreign government, foreign
8	person, or international organization and is based upon such other
9	person's race, color, creed,gender, religion, sex, national origin, age,
10	physical disability or foreign trade relationships;
11	(5) To willfully and knowingly aid or abet any other person to engage in
12	conduct which is prohibited by this Chapter.
13	(b) It shall be unlawful for any person doing business in the State to discriminate
14	on the basis of race, gender, religion, national origin, age or physical disability, or on
15	the basis of any otherwise unlawful use of characteristics against a vendor, supplier,
16	subcontractor, or commercial customer by any disadvantage, difference, distinction, or
17	preference in the solicitation, selection, hiring or treatment of the person. Nothing in this
18	subsection shall prohibit or limit otherwise lawful efforts to remedy the effects or
19	discrimination that has occurred or is occurring in the marketplace."
20	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 143-135.5(b) reads as rewritten:
21	"(b) It is the policy of this State for its agencies, institutions, and political
22	subdivisions not to accept bids or proposals from, nor to engage in business with, any
23	business that, within the last two years, has been finally found by a court or an
24	administrative agency of competent jurisdiction to have unlawfully discriminated on the
25	basis of race, gender, religion, national origin, age, physical disability, or any other
26	unlawful basis in its solicitation, selection, hiring, or treatment of another business."
27	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
