30	glazing contractor's license number shall appear on all proposals, contracts, or requests
31	for permits issued by municipalities.
32	(e) <u>A license may not be transferred or assigned.</u>
33	" <u>§ 87-64.18. Disciplinary procedures.</u>
34	The Board may deny or refuse to renew, suspend, or revoke a license if the licensee
35	or applicant:
36	(1) <u>Gives false information to or withholds information from the Board in</u>
37	procuring or attempting to procure a license.
38	(2) <u>Has been convicted of or pled guilty or no contest to a crime that</u>
39	indicates the person is unfit or incompetent to engage in business as a
40	glass glazing contractor, that involves moral turpitude, or that indicates
41	the person has deceived or defrauded the public.
42	(3) Has demonstrated gross negligence, incompetency, or misconduct
43	while engaging in business as a glass glazing contractor.
44	(4) <u>Has willfully violated any of the provisions of this Article.</u>

1	" <u>§ 87-64.19. Exemptions.</u>
2	The provisions of this Article shall not apply to:
3	(1) Any person performing glass glazing work on property owned by the
4	person when the property is not intended for rent, lease, or sale at the
5	time the work is performed.
6	(2) Any person performing glass glazing work where the price of all
7	contracts for labor, material, and other items during any consecutive
8	12-month period is less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
9	" <u>§ 87-64.20. Injunctive relief.</u>
10	The Board may apply to the superior court for an order enjoining violations of this
11	Article. Upon a showing by the Board that any person has violated this Article, the court
12	may grant injunctive relief.
13	" <u>§ 87-64.21. Public awareness program.</u>
14	The Board shall establish and implement a public awareness program to inform the
15	general public of the purpose and function of the Board."
16	<b>SECTION 2.</b> Any person who submits proof to the Board that the person
17	has been actively engaged in business as a glass glazing contractor in this State for at
18	least two consecutive years prior to the effective date of this act and has performed glass
19	glazing work on contracts in an amount exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000), and
20	pays the required fee for the issuance of a license under G.S. 87-64.16, enacted by
21	Section 1 of this act, shall be licensed without having to satisfy the requirements of G.S.
22	87-64.14(3), enacted by Section 1 of this act. All persons who do not make application
23	to the Board within one year of the effective date of this act shall be required to
24	complete all requirements prescribed by the Board and to otherwise comply with the
25	provisions of Article 5A of Chapter 87 of the General Statutes, enacted by Section 1 of
26	this act.
27	SECTION 3. G.S. 87-64.12 and G.S. 87-64.13, as enacted in Section 1 of
28	this act, are effective when this act becomes law. The remainder of this act becomes
29	effective July 1, 2004.
