1    A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE LIFE AND MEMORY OF JANE  
2    HURLEY MOSLEY, FORMER MEMBER OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

3        Whereas, Jane Hurley Mosley was born on July 4, 1945, in Wake County to  
4        James Thaw Hurley and Sarah Alford Hurley; and

5        Whereas, Jane Mosley graduated from Cary High School and attended North  
6        Carolina State University, North Carolina Wesleyan College, and Pacific Western  
7        University; and

8        Whereas, Jane Mosley worked in the field of public relations for a number of  
9        years, serving as Public Information Officer for the Department of Community  
10      Colleges, Information and Communications Specialist for the North Carolina  
11      Department of Natural Resources and Community Development, Coordinator for  
12      Student Development Services of the Visiting Artist Program for the Department of  
13      Community Colleges, Executive Director of the North Carolina Community College  
14      Alumni Scholarship Foundation, Inc., Public Relations Consultant for North Carolina  
15      Operation Lifesaver, Inc., and State Coordinator and President of Cary Public Relations,  
16      Inc.; and

17       Whereas, Jane Mosley proudly served her profession as a member of  
18      numerous organizations, including the North Carolina Passenger Safety Association,  
19      North Carolina Employees for Traffic Safety, North Carolina Law Enforcement  
20      Officers Association, North Carolina Association of Government Information Officers,  
21      Public Relations Society of America, the Governor's Highway Safety Association, and  
22      Community College Adult Educators Association; and

23       Whereas, Jane Mosley served her community in many worthwhile capacities,  
24      serving as President of the Wake County Unit of the North Carolina Division of the  
25      American Cancer Society, Vice-President of Public Government Affairs for the Cary  
26      Chamber of Commerce, Executive Coordinator of the Cary Clean Community System,  
27      and President, Vice-President, and Regional Director of the Cary Jaycettes and North  
28      Carolina Jaycettes; and

1       Whereas, Jane Mosley also served as a board member of the North Carolina  
2       Community College Alumni Foundation, Inc., North Carolina Operation Lifesaver, Inc.,  
3       Wake County Arts Council, and Rex Home Care, and the Cary Chamber of Commerce;  
4       and

5       Whereas, Jane Mosley served with honor and distinction as a member of the  
6       House of Representatives from 1993 to 1994 and 1996 to 1999, contributing as a  
7       member of numerous committees, including Ethics, Finance, Public Utilities, Election  
8       Law and Campaign Reform, the Education Subcommittee on Community Colleges and  
9       Universities, and the Transportation Subcommittee on Highways; and

10      Whereas, Jane Mosley's commitment to improving safety at railroad crossings  
11     earned her the North Carolina State Highway Patrol Award for Safety in 1995, the  
12     Governor's Certificate of Appreciation for Safety in 1995, and the North Carolina Safety  
13     Award/Second in the Nation from North Carolina Operation Lifesaver, Inc., in 1990,  
14     1991, 1994, 1995; and

15      Whereas, Jane Mosley was recognized as the Most Outstanding Woman in  
16     State Government in 1972 and 1981, Volunteer of the Year (Ralph Whitaker Memorial  
17     Award) by the American Cancer Society in 1985, Tarheel of the Week in 1986, and  
18     Citizen of the Year by the Cary Chamber of Commerce in 1995; and

19      Whereas, Jane Mosley was active in the First United Methodist Church in  
20     Cary; and

21      Whereas, Jane Mosley died on September 28, 1999; and

22      Whereas, Jane Mosley is survived by her husband, Jerry W. Mosley, a son,  
23     Carlton Mosley, and a daughter, Kimberly Mosley White; Now, therefore,  
24     Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:

25      **SECTION 1.** The General Assembly honors the life and memory of Jane  
26     Hurley Mosley and expresses the appreciation of this State and its citizens for the  
27     service she rendered.

28      **SECTION 2.** The General Assembly expresses its deepest sympathy to the  
29     family and friends of Jane Hurley Mosley for the loss of a beloved family member.

30      **SECTION 3.** The Secretary of State shall transmit a certified copy of this  
31     resolution to the family of Jane Hurley Mosley.

32      **SECTION 4.** This resolution is effective upon ratification.
