A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO PROVIDE TO PUBLIC SCHOOL 3 PERSONNEL AND TO STATE EMPLOYEES A LEGISLATIVE PAY 4 INCREASE OF FIVE PERCENT AND ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM LIVING 5 WAGE FOR STATE-FUNDED EMPLOYEES. 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 7 SECTION 1. Section 30.13 of S.L. 2003-284 reads as rewritten: 8 "SECTION 30.13.(a) The salaries in effect June 30, 2003, of all permanent 9 full-time State employees whose salaries are set in accordance with the State Personnel Act, and who are paid from the General Fund or the Highway Fund shall remain in 10 11 effect for the 2003-2004 and 2004-2005 fiscal years, fiscal year, and there shall be awarded a compensation bonus for the 2003-2004 fiscal year as authorized in this Part. 12 Effective July 1, 2004, the salaries of all permanent full-time State employees whose 13 14 salaries are set in accordance with the State Personnel Act, and who are paid from the General Fund or the Highway Fund shall be increased by five percent (5%), unless 15 otherwise provided by this act. 16 17 "SECTION 30.13.(b) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the compensation of permanent full-time State officials and persons in exempt positions that are 18 recommended by the Governor or the Governor and the Advisory Budget Commission 19 20 and set by the General Assembly shall remain in effect, and there shall be awarded a compensation bonus for the 2003-2004 fiscal year as authorized in this Part. Effective 21 22 July 1, 2004, the compensation of permanent full-time State officials and persons in exempt positions that are recommended by the Governor or the Governor and the 23

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Advisory Budget Commission and set by the General Assembly shall be increased by 1 2 five percent (5%), unless otherwise provided by this act. 3 "SECTION 30.13.(c) The For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the salaries of all 4 permanent part-time State employees shall remain in effect, and there shall be awarded 5 a compensation bonus for the 2003-2004 fiscal year as authorized in this Part. 6 "SECTION 30.13.(d) The Director of the Budget may allocate out of special 7 operating funds or from other sources of the employing agency, except tax revenues, 8 sufficient funds for salaries in accordance with subsection (a), (b), or (c) of this section 9 including funds for the employer's retirement and social security contributions, for the 10 permanent full-time and part-time employees of the agency, provided the employing agency elects to make available the necessary funds." 11 12 SECTION 2. Section 30.14 of S.L. 2003-284 reads as rewritten: "SECTION 30.14.(a) Salaries and related benefits for positions that are funded 13 14 partially from the General Fund or Highway Fund and partially from sources other than 15 the General Fund or Highway Fund shall remain in effect and be paid from the General Fund or Highway Fund appropriation only to the extent of the proportionate part of the 16 17 salaries paid from the General Fund or Highway Fund. 18 "SECTION 30.14.(a1) Effective July 1, 2004, salaries and related benefits for positions that are funded partially from the General Fund or Highway Fund and partially 19 20 from sources other than the General Fund or Highway Fund shall be increased from the 21 General Fund or Highway Fund appropriation only to the extent of the proportionate part of the salaries paid from the General Fund or Highway Fund. 22 23 "SECTION 30.14.(b) The salaries authorized under this act do not affect the status 24 of eligibility for salary increments for which employees may be eligible unless 25 otherwise required by this act. "SECTION 30.14.(c) The compensation bonuses do not apply to persons separated 26 27 from State service due to resignation, dismissal, reduction in force, death, or retirement, or whose last workday is prior to October 1, 2003. The salary increases provided by this 28 29 Part are to be effective July 1, 2004, and do not apply to persons separated from State 30 service due to resignation, dismissal, reduction-in-force, death, or retirement, whose last work day is prior to July 1, 2004. This subsection shall apply to all employees, subject 31 32 to or exempt from the State Personnel Act, paid from State funds, including public 33 schools, community colleges, and The University of North Carolina. "SECTION 30.14.(d) The Director of the Budget shall transfer from the Reserve 34 35 for Compensation Increases in this act for fiscal year 2003-2004 and fiscal year 2004-2005 all funds necessary for the compensation increases provided by this act, 36 37 including funds for the employer's retirement and social security contributions. 38 "SECTION 30.14.(e) Nothing in this act authorizes the transfer of funds between 39 the General Fund and the Highway Fund for salary increases. "SECTION 30.14.(f) All permanent, full-time State-supported personnel shall be 40 paid a minimum salary of eighteen thousand five hundred dollars (\$18,500) per year." 41 42 SECTION 3.(a) Section 30.1(a) of S.L. 2003-284 reads as rewritten: 43 "SECTION 30.1.(a) For the 2003-2004 and 2004-2005 fiscal years, fiscal year, the 44 salary of the Governor shall remain the amount set by G.S. 147-11(a)."
