A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE EIGHT-YEAR DRIVERS LICENSES AND INTERNER RENEWAL OF DRIVERS LICENSES.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 20-7(f) reads as rewritten:			
"(f) <u>Duration and Renewal of Licenses.</u> – <u>Expiration and Temporary Licenses.</u> The first drivers license the Division issues to a person expires on the person's fourth subsequent birthday that occurs after the license is issued and on which the individual age is evenly divisible by five, unless this subsection sets a different expiration date. first drivers license may be issued for a shorter duration if the Division determines that license of shorter duration should be issued when the applicant holds a visa of limit duration issued by the United States Department of State. The first drivers license to Division issues to a person who is at least 17 years old but is less than 18 years of expires on the person's twentieth birthday. The first drivers license the Division issue to a person who is at least 62 years old expires on the person's birthday in the fifth yeafter the license is issued, whether or not the person's age on that birthday is even divisible by five.	or al's A at a ed the old nes

(3) Internet renewal of license authorized for certain persons. – T Division is authorized to renew a drivers license electronically			

1		accordance with this subdivision. The Division may waive the sign
2		tests for applicants renewing electronically. A person who holds a
3		commercial drivers license and is required by federal regulations to be
4		retested shall not renew electronically. A person may renew his or her
5		drivers license electronically for one five-year period at the time of
6		each expiration of a license issued in a drivers license office if all of
7		the following apply:
8		a. The person has no more than two reportable accidents on his or
9		her drivers license record in the previous year.
10		b. The person has no restrictions other than a restriction for
11		corrective lenses on his or her drivers license record in the
12		previous year.
13		<u>c.</u> The person has four or fewer drivers license points.
14		d. The person is at least 25 years old and less than 60 years old.
15		e. The person has obtained an eye examination by a licensed
16		ophthalmologist or licensed optometrist within 12 months prior
17		to the date of electronic renewal, and the results of the
18		examination are submitted to the Division by the
19		ophthalmologist or optometrist to the Division at the time of the
20		application for the electronic renewal.
21	<u>(4)</u>	<u>Duration of license for certain visa holders.</u> A drivers license that
21 22		was issued by the Division and is renewed by the Division expires five
23		years at the end of the period provided by this subsection after the
23 24		expiration date of the license that is renewed unless the Division
25 26		determines that a license of shorter duration should be issued when the
26		applicant holds a visa of limited duration from the United States
27		Department of State. A person may apply to the Division to renew a
28		license during the 180 day period before the license expires. The
29		Division may not accept an application for renewal made before the
30		180 day period begins.
31	<u>(5)</u>	<u>Renewal by Mail. – The Division may renew by mail a drivers license</u>
32		issued by the Division to a person who meets any of the following
33		descriptions:
34		(1)a. Is serving on active duty in the armed forces of the United
35		States and is stationed outside this State.
36		(2) <u>b.</u> Is a resident of this State and has been residing outside the State
37		for at least 30 continuous days.
38		wing a license by mail, the Division may waive the examination that
39	would otherwis	se be required for the renewal and may impose any conditions it finds

advisable. A license renewed by mail is a temporary license that expires 60 days after the person to whom it is issued returns to this State."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 2005.
