A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FIFTEEN MILLION DOLLARS TO THE RURAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CENTER TO BE USED TO CREATE A NORTH CAROLINA ECONOMIC INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Rural Economic Development Center, Inc., the sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000) for the 2004-2005 fiscal year. The funds shall be used to establish and implement the North Carolina Economic Infrastructure Program. The Program shall consist of the following four areas of investment: (1) To provide grants to local governments to construct critical water and

(3	and equity investments in public-private ventures that will productively reuse vacant buildings, with priority given to towns with

SECTION 3. The Rural Economic Development Center, Inc., may use up to five percent (5%) of the funds appropriated by this act to cover its expenses in administering the North Carolina Economic Infrastructure Program.

SECTION 4. The Rural Economic Development Center, Inc., shall report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Governmental Operations on a quarterly basis concerning the progress of the North Carolina Economic Infrastructure Program. It must make its initial report on the program no later than January 15, 2005.

SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
