1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS TO OPERATE 2 "CASINO NIGHTS."

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 37 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-309.16. Casino nights.

- (a) It is lawful for any nonprofit organization or association, recognized by the Department of Revenue as tax-exempt pursuant to G.S. 105-130.11(a), to conduct a casino night in accordance with this section. Any person who conducts a casino night in violation of any provision of this section shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor. Upon conviction, that person shall not conduct a casino night for a period of one year. It is lawful to participate in a casino night conducted pursuant to this section. It shall not constitute a violation of State law to advertise a casino night conducted in accordance with this section. A casino night conducted pursuant to this section is not "gambling".
- (b) For purposes of this section, "casino night" includes "Monte Carlo night," "Millionaire night," or any event, by whatever name, conducted in accordance with this section.
- (c) Casino nights shall be limited to four nights per nonprofit organization per year.
 - (d) The conducting of casino nights shall be subject to the following restrictions:
 - (1) No person, except a bona fide member of the organization conducting the casino night, or a volunteer recruited by the organization conducting the casino night, may participate in the management of the operation of the event. A person participates in the management or operation of an event when he or she sells admission tickets to the event; sells, redeems, or in any way assists in the selling or redeeming of chips, scrip, or play money; participates in the conducting of any of the games played during the event, or supervises, directs, or instructs anyone conducting a game; or at any time during the hours of the event

1		counts, handles, or supervises anyone counting or handling any of the
2		proceeds or chips, scrip, or play money at the event. A person who is
3		present to ensure that the games are being conducted in conformance
4		with the rules established by the organization conducting the event or
5		is present to ensure that the equipment is working properly is
6		considered to be participating in the management of the operation of
7		the event. Setting up, cleaning up, selling food and drink, or providing
8		security for persons or property at the event does not constitute
9		participation in the management or operation of the event.
10	<u>(2)</u>	No person may receive any remuneration or compensation either
11		directly or indirectly from any source for participating in the
12		management of the casino night.
13	(3)	No single bet at any game may exceed ten dollars (\$10.00).
14	$\frac{\overline{(4)}}{(4)}$	A bank shall be established on the premises to convert currency into
15	<u> </u>	chips, scrip, or other form of play money that shall then be used to
16		play at games of chance that the participant chooses. Chips, scrip, or
17		play money shall be marked with the logo of the organization
18		conducting the casino night or the logo of the supplier of the chips,
19		scrip, or play money. Each participant shall be issued a receipt
20		indicating the amount of chips, scrip, or play money purchased.
21	<u>(5)</u>	At the conclusion of the casino night or when the participant leaves, he
22		or she may be permitted by the organization conducting the event to
23		cash in his or her chips, scrip, or play money in exchange for noncash
24		prizes. Each participant shall sign for any receipt of prizes.
25	<u>(6)</u>	Casino nights shall not be conducted between the hours of 2:00 A.M.
26		and noon.
27	<u>(7)</u>	No person under the age of 18 years may play or participate in the
28		conducting of a casino night. Any person under the age of 18 years
29		may be within the area where the event is being conducted only when
30		accompanied by his or her parent or guardian.
31	<u>(8)</u>	Only the following games may be conducted at a casino night and only
32		after the rules for the games are posted or printed and made available
33		to all participants by the organization conducting the event:
34		a. Roulette.
35		b. Blackjack.

37		<u>c.</u> Poker.<u>d.</u> Pull tabs.
38		e. Craps.
39		e. <u>Craps.</u> f. <u>Chuck-a-luck.</u>
40		g. Keno.

42	<u>(9)</u>	No slot machines or coin-operated devices that allow a participant to
43	127	play games of chance based on cards or dice shall be permitted at the
44		location and during the time the casino night is operated.

1	<u>(10)</u>	No cards, dice, wheels, or other equipment may be modified or altered
2		so as to give the organization conducting the casino night a greater
3		advantage in winning, other than as provided under the normal rules of
4		play of a particular game.
5	<u>(11)</u>	No credit shall be extended to any of the participants.
6	(e) Casin	o nights shall not be conducted in conjunction with bingo.
7	$\underline{\text{(f)}}$ As us	ed in this subsection, "net proceeds of a casino night" means the receipts
8	less the cost of	prizes awarded. No less than ninety percent (90%) of the net proceeds of
9	a casino night s	hall be used by the nonprofit organization or association for charitable,
10	religious, educa	tional, civic, or other nonprofit purposes. None of the net proceeds of
11	the casino night	may be used to pay any person to conduct the casino night, or to rent a
12	building where	the tickets are received or sold or the drawing is conducted."
