8	The Gen	eral Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9		SECTION 1. G.S. 20-140.4 reads as rewritten:
10	"§ 20-14	0.4. Special provisions for motorcycles and mopeds.
11	(a)	No person shall operate a motorcycle or moped upon a highway or public
12	vehicula	area:
13		(1) When the number of persons upon such motorcycle or moped,
14		including the operator, shall exceed the number of persons which it
15		was designed to carry.
16		(2) Unless the operator and all passengers thereon wear safety helmets of a
17		type approved by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.
18	(b)	Violation of any provision of this section shall not be considered negligence
19	per se or	contributory negligence per se in any civil action.
20	(c)	Any person convicted of violating this section shall have committed an
21	infractio	and shall be fined according to G.S. 20-135.2A(e) and (f).
22	<u>(a)</u>	No person shall operate a motorcycle or moped upon a highway or public
23		area when the number of persons on the motorcycle or moped, including the
24	operator	exceeds the number of persons that it was designed to carry.
25	<u>(b)</u>	Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d) of this section, a person may not
26	-	or ride upon a motorcycle or moped unless the person is properly wearing a
27	<u>safety he</u>	lmet of a type approved by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.

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1	(c) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, a person over 21 years of age			
2	may operate a motorcycle without wearing a safety helmet if the operator held a			
3	motorcycle license or a motorcycle endorsement prior to October 1, 2003, or if the			
4	following conditions are met:			
5	(1) The operator has successfully completed the course of instruction			
6	offered by the Motorcycle Safety Instruction Program authorized in			
7	G.S. 115D-72, or its equivalent as determined by the Commissioner,			
8	and the operator has had a motorcycle license or a motorcycle			
9	endorsement for more than 12 months.			
10	(2) The operator is covered by an insurance policy providing for at least			
11	ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in medical benefits for injuries incurred			
12	as a result of a crash while operating or riding on a motorcycle.			
13	(d) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, a person over 21 years of age			
14	may ride upon a motorcycle without wearing a safety helmet if the operator is allowed			
15	to operate a motorcycle without a helmet pursuant to subsection (c) of this section, and			
16	the person is covered by an insurance policy providing for at least ten thousand dollars			
17	(\$10,000) in medical benefits for injuries incurred as a result of a crash while riding on			
18	<u>a motorcycle.</u>			
19	(e) <u>Violation of any provision of this section shall not be considered negligence</u>			
20	per se or contributory negligence per se in any civil action.			
21	(f) Any person convicted of violating this section shall have committed an			
22	infraction and shall be fined according to G.S. 20-135.2A(e) and (f).			
23	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-87(6) is repealed.			
24	SECTION 3. G.S. 20-87 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:			
25	"§ 20-87. Passenger vehicle registration fees.			
26	These shall be paid to the Division annually, as of the first day of January, for the			
27	registration and licensing of passenger vehicles, fees according to the following			
28	classifications and schedules:

30	(13) <u>Private Motorcycles. – The fee on private passenger motorcycles shall</u>			
31	be fourteen dollars (\$14.00). When a motorcycle is equipped with an			
32	additional form of device designed to transport persons or property, the			
33	fee shall be twenty-one dollars (\$21.00). Five dollars (\$5.00) of the			
34	fees collected pursuant to this subdivision shall be used, in addition to			
35	any other funds appropriated for this purpose, to fund the Motorcycle			
36	Safety Instruction Program established pursuant to G.S. 115D-72."			
37	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective October 1, 2004, and applies to			
38	violations occurring on or after that date.
