10 Notwithstanding any other provisions of Chapter 143B, no records of the <del>Division of</del> 11 Veterans Affairs in the Department of Administration Veterans Affairs shall be 12 disclosed or used for any purpose except for official purposes, and no records shall be 13 disclosed, destroyed or used in any manner which is in violation of any existing federal 14 law or regulation. Nothing in this Chapter shall convert records which are the property 15 of the federal government into State property."
