The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SEC	FION 1. Establishment of Emergency Medica	1 Service Fee. – The
Board of Commissioners of Pender County may by ordinance establish an Emergency		
Medical Service Fee. The ordinance shall become effective on July 1 of the next fiscal		
year after its adoption.		
SECTION 2. Changes in Rate of Emergency Medical Service Fee. – Any		
change in the rate of the Emergency Medical Service Fee must be made by ordinance of		
the Pender County Board of Commissioners by June 30 of any year with an effective		
date of July 1 of the next fiscal year.		
SECTION 3. Components of the Emergency Medical Service Fee. – The		
Emergency Medical Service Fee shall consist of a flat fee per parcel that contains any of		
the following structures:		
(1)	Single family home.

(3)	Condominium.
