5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 14-49 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 14-49. Malicious use of explosive or incendiary; punishment.
8	(a) Any person who willfully and maliciously injures another by the use of any
9	explosive or incendiary device or material is guilty of a Class D- <u>B1</u> felony.
10	(b) Any person who willfully and maliciously damages any real or personal
11	property of any kind or nature belonging to another by the use of any explosive or
12	incendiary device or material is guilty of a Class G-D felony.
13	(b1) Any person who willfully and maliciously damages, aids, counsels, or
14	procures the damaging of any church, chapel, synagogue, mosque, masjid, or other
15	building of worship by the use of any explosive or incendiary device or material is
16	guilty of a Class E - <u>C</u> felony.
17	(c) Repealed by Session Laws 1993, c. 539, s. 1149."
18	SECTION 2. G.S. 14-49.1 reads as rewritten:
19	"§ 14-49.1. Malicious damage of occupied property by use of explosive or
20	incendiary; punishment.
21	Any person who willfully and maliciously damages any real or personal property of
22	any kind or nature, being at the time occupied by another, by the use of any explosive or
23	incendiary device or material is guilty of a felony punishable as a Class <u>D-B1</u> felony."
24	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to
25	offenses committed on or after that date.
