4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 163-98 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 163-98. General election participation by new political party.
7	In the first general election following the date on which a new political party
8	qualifies under the provisions of G.S. 163-96, it shall be entitled to have the names of its
9	candidates for national, State, congressional, and local offices printed on the official
10	ballots.
11	For the first general election following the date on which it qualifies under G.S.
12	163-96, a new political party shall select its candidates by party convention. Following
13	adjournment of the nominating convention, but not later than the first day of July prior
14	to the general election, the president of the convention shall certify to the State Board of
15	Elections the names of persons chosen in the convention as the new party's candidates
16	for State, congressional, and national offices in the ensuing general election. At the time
17	their names are certified, each person nominated shall pay to the State Board of
18	Elections the same amount that a candidate filing for the same office in a party primary
19	would be required to pay under G.S. 163-107. In lieu of making that payment, the
20	candidate may file with the State Board a written petition that meets the requirements
21	set forth in G.S. 163-107.1 for a candidate for the same office filing in a party primary.
22	The State Board of Elections shall print names thus certified on the appropriate ballots
23	as the nominees of the new party. The State Board of Elections shall send to each
24	county board of elections the list of any new party candidates so that the county board
25	can add those names to the appropriate ballot."
26	SECTION 2. G.S. 163-107.1(a) reads as rewritten:

1 "(a) Any qualified voter who seeks nomination in the party primary of the 2 political party with which he affiliates <u>or who receives the nomination of a political</u> 3 <u>party under G.S. 163-98</u> may, in lieu of payment of any filing fee required for the office 4 he seeks, file a written petition requesting him to be a candidate for a specified office 5 with the appropriate board of elections, State, county or municipal."

6 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective January 1, 2004, and applies to all 7 primaries and elections held after that date.
