3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
4	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Section 4.1 of the Charter of the Town of Oak Island, being			
5	S.L. 1999-66, reads as rewritten:			
6	"Sec. 4.1. Interim Mayor and Council and Succession of Interim Council			
7	Members and Mayors. (a) Upon enactment of this act and on the effective date of			
8	consolidation, an interim Town Council shall serve until elections are held in			
9	accordance with provisions of this Charter. The following individuals are hereby named			
10	to serve as the Interim Council: Linda W. Franklin, Roy R. Johnson, Richard D.			
11	Marshall, William	S. Smith, Martin .	John Wozniak, Kevin M	. Bell (or the person
12	appointed to succee	d him on the Long l	Beach Town Council), Ho	race Collier, James H.

32	two years thereafter, there shall be elected a Mayor by the qualified voters of the Town			
33	voting at large. The Mayor shall serve for a term of two years. A <u>permanent</u> vacancy in			
34	the office of Mayor shall be filled for the unexpired term by a person appointed by the			
35	Town Council. The Mayor shall take the oath of office before entry upon the duties of			
36	his office. Candidates for Mayor shall file a notice of candidacy as is required by			
37	candidates for Town Council.			
38	The Mayor shall be the official head of the Town government, shall preside at all			
39	meetings of the Town Council, but shall have the right to vote when there are equal			
40	numbers of votes in the affirmative and in the negative. The Mayor shall exercise such			
41	powers and perform such duties as are or may be conferred upon him by the general			
42	laws of North Carolina, by this Charter, and by the ordinances of the Town. The Town			
43	Council shall choose one of its number to act as Mayor Pro Tempore, and he shall			
44	perform the duties	of the Mayor in the M	layor's absence or dis	ability. The Mayor Pro

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Tempore as such shall have no fixed term of office, but shall serve in such capacity at 1 2 the pleasure of the remaining members of the Town Council.shall serve for a term of 3 one year." 4 **SECTION 5.** Section 4.6(b) of the Charter of the Town of Oak Island, being 5 S.L. 1999-66, reads as rewritten: 6 "(b) All meetings of the Town Council shall be open to the public.public, and shall be governed by the open meeting laws as provided by general law and as amended 7 8 from time to time. The Town Council shall not by closed session or otherwise formally 9 consider or vote upon any question in private session." 10 **SECTION 6.** Section 5.1 of the Charter of the Town of Oak Island, being S.L. 1999-66, reads as rewritten: 11 12 "Sec. 5.1. Regular Municipal Elections. At the regular municipal election to be held following the succession of the Interim Council, and every two years thereafter, 13 14 four-three members of the Town Council shall be elected to serve for four-year terms." **SECTION 7.** This act is effective when it becomes law. 15
