## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 2 AN ACT TO UPDATE THE LAWS RELATING TO THE ATTENDANCE AGES 3 AND ELIGIBILITY OF STUDENTS FOR NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOLS FOR 4 THE DEAF. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 143B-216.41 reads as rewritten: 6 7 "§ 143B-216.41. Pupils admitted; education. 8 The Department of Health and Human Services shall shall, according to such 9 reasonable regulations as prescribed by the Board of Directors may prescribe, 10 Superintendent of the Office of Education Services, on application, receive into the 11 schools for the purposes of education all deaf-deaf, hard-of-hearing, and deaf/blind 12 children resident who: (i) have been referred by their local education agencies and meet 13 the criteria for admission; (ii) are residents of the State whoState; and (iii) are from age 14 five through age 20 years: Provided, that the Department of Health and Human Services may admit students who are not within the age limits set forth above when in its 15 16 judgment, such admission will be in the best interests of the applicant and the facilities 17 of the school permit such admission.21 years. Only those who are bona fide citizens or residents of North Carolina shall be eligible to and entitled to receive free tuition and 18 19 maintenance. The Department may fix charges and the Board of 20 DirectorsSuperintendent of the Office of Education Services may prescribe rules whereby nonresident deaf deaf, hard-of-hearing, and deaf/blind children may be 21 22 admitted, but in no event shall the admission of nonresidents in any way prevent the 23 attendance of any eligible deaf child, deaf, hard-of-hearing, or deaf/blind child who is a resident of North Carolina. The Department shall provide for the instruction of all pupils 24 25 in the branches of study now prescribed by law for the public schools of the State and in such any other branches as may be of special benefit to the deaf.deaf, hard of hearing, 26 27 and deaf/blind. 28 The Department shall encourage the State to provide the classrooms with modern

auditory training equipment, audiovisual media equipment, and any other special 29

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- 1 equipment to provide the best educational conditions for the deaf.deaf, hard of hearing,
- 2 <u>and deaf/blind.</u> The Department shall provide a teacher training program in the State.
- 3 The Department shall provide for a comprehensive vocational and technical training
- 4 program for boys and girlsstudents as may be useful to them in making themselves
- 5 self-supporting." 6 **SECT** 
  - **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
