2	AN ACT TO ENACT THE NORTH CAROLINA STREET GANG TERRORISM
3	AND PREVENTION ACT OF 2003.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a
6	new Article to read:
7	" <u>Article 13A.</u>
8	"North Carolina Street Gang and Terrorism Prevention Act.
9	" <u>§ 14-50.15. Short title.</u>
10	This Article shall be known and may be cited as the "North Carolina Street Gang
11	Terrorism and Prevention Act".
12	" <u>§ 14-50.16. Legislative findings and intent.</u>
13	(a) The General Assembly finds and declares that it is the right of every person to
14	be secure and protected from fear, intimidation, and physical harm caused by the
15	activities of violent groups and individuals. It is not the intent of this Article to interfere
16	with the exercise of the constitutionally protected rights of freedom of expression and
17	association. The General Assembly recognizes the constitutional right of every citizen
18	to harbor and express beliefs on any lawful subject whatsoever, to associate lawfully
19	with others who share similar beliefs, to petition lawfully constituted authority for a
20	redress of perceived grievances, and to participate in the electoral process.
21	(b) The General Assembly, however, further finds that the State of North
22	Carolina is in a state of crisis that has been caused by violent street gangs whose
23	members threaten, terrorize, and commit a multitude of crimes against the peaceful
24	citizens of their neighborhoods. These activities, both individually and collectively,
25	present a clear and present danger to public order and safety and are not constitutionally
26	protected.
27	(c) <u>The General Assembly finds that there are criminal street gangs operating in</u>
28	North Carolina and that the number of gang-related murders is increasing. It is the intent

of the General Assembly in enacting this Article to seek the eradication of criminal

21		addition to any other penalty imposed by law, be punished as a Class E
22		felon.
23	<u>(2)</u>	A person who violates subsection (c) of this section may, in addition to
24		any other penalty provided by law, be punished by imprisonment for
25		an additional 10 years which shall be served consecutively to any other
26		sentence imposed on the person by law.
27	<u>(3)</u>	A person who violates subsection (d), (e), or (f) of this section shall, in
28		addition to any other penalty provided by law, be punished as a Class
29		<u>G felon.</u>

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1	"§ 14-50.20. Local ordinances not preempted by State law.
2	Nothing in this Article shall prevent a local governing body from adopting and
3	enforcing ordinances relating to gangs and gang violence that are consistent with this
4	Article. Where local laws duplicate or supplement the provisions of this Article, this
5	Article shall be construed as providing alternative remedies and not as preempting the
6	<u>field.</u>
7	"§ 14-50.21. Real property used by criminal street gangs declared a public
8	nuisance; abatement; persons injured by gangs entitled to treble
9	damages.
10	Any real property that is erected, established, maintained, owned, leased, or used by
11	any criminal street gang for the purpose of conducting criminal gang activity shall
12	constitute a public nuisance and may be abated as provided by Article 1 of Chapter 19
13	of the General Statutes.
14	" <u>§ 14-50.22. Matters proved in criminal trial court.</u>
15	A conviction of an offense defined as criminal gang activity shall estop the
16	defendant in any subsequent civil action or proceeding as to matters proved in the
17	criminal proceeding."
18	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to
19	offenses committed on or after that date.
