eligible to be selected as nursing faculty in the university, community college, and

hospital schools of nursing by completing a full-time program in nursing education in

an approved program, as follows:

- 1 (1) Approved programs are those programs offered by colleges and universities in this State.
 - (2) The number of scholarship loan awards per year shall be based on the State's need for nursing faculty and within funds available, but in no event shall more than 100 nursing faculty fellows scholarship loans be made in each year.
 - (3) In order to attract faculty fellow graduates to a particular school of nursing, that school of nursing may use a portion of its funds for nursing faculty to cover one-half of the cost of the two-year scholarship loan program in exchange for a two-year commitment to the school from the nursing faculty fellow. To qualify for this option, a school of nursing must maintain an attrition rate of not more than twenty-five percent (25%) for the previous two years and meet all North Carolina Board of Nursing standards for program approval.
 - (d) The Commission shall adopt stringent standards to ensure that only the best potential students receive scholarship loans under the Program. The standards may include standardized test scores, undergraduate performance, job experience and performance, leadership abilities, and other standards the Commission deems appropriate. The Commission shall consider the qualifications of all applicants in a manner that is fair and without regard to gender or race, and that takes into account the geographic diversity of the State. The Commission may award scholarship loans under the Program only to applicants that meet the Commission's standards, are domiciled in this State, and agree to work as nursing faculty in a North Carolina school of nursing.
 - (e) The Commission may form regional review committees to assist in identifying the best applicants for the Program. The Commission and the review committees shall make an effort to identify and encourage men and minorities and others who may not otherwise consider a career as a nursing faculty member to apply for the Program.
 - (f) Upon the naming of recipients of loans from the Program, the Commission shall inform the State Education Assistance Authority (SEAA) of its decisions. The SEAA shall perform all of the administrative functions necessary to implement this Article, which functions shall include: rulemaking, dissemination of information, disbursement, receipt, liaison with participating educational institutions, determination of the acceptability of service repayment agreements, and all other functions necessary for the execution, payment, and enforcement of promissory notes required under this Article.

"§ 90-171.98. Terms of loans, receipt and disbursement of funds.

(a) All scholarship loans shall be evidenced by notes made payable to the State Education Assistance Authority (SEAA) and bear interest at the rate of ten percent (10%) per year beginning 90 days after completion of the Program, or 90 days after termination of the scholarship loan, whichever is earlier. The scholarship loan may be terminated upon the recipient's withdrawal from school or by the recipient's failure to meet the standards of the Commission.
