20	the applicant shall be required to pass an examination administered by the Board before
21	the Board may issue the license. The Board shall establish the scope and subject matter
22	of the examination to be administered. The Board shall recognize the Certified
23	Irrigation Contractor (CIC) examination, or any other comparable examination, as an
24	approved examination to become licensed as an irrigation contractor.
25	(c) Examinations shall be held at least twice a year at a time and place to be
26	determined by the Board.
27	(d) When the Board determines that an applicant has met all the qualifications for
28	licensure and has submitted the required fee, the Board shall issue a license to the
29	applicant.
30	(e) The Board may issue a license in the name of a corporation provided one or
31	more of the officers or full-time employees that are empowered to act for the
32	corporation are licensed in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter. In addition to
33	the provisions of this Chapter, a corporation shall do all of the following when a license
34	is issued in the name of the corporation:
35	(1) The officer or full-time employee licensed under this Chapter who is
36	empowered to act for the corporation shall execute contracts in the
37	name of the corporation to the extent of the license qualifications of
38	the individual.

Persons who had an established place of business prior to January 1, 2004, 1 (g) 2 and who produce satisfactory evidence that they are engaged in the landscape business 3 as defined in G.S. 89D-11 and were not registered under G.S. 89D-1 through G.S. 4 89D-10, may apply for a landscape contractor's provisional license on or before July 1, 5 2004. The Board shall issue a provisional license, valid up to July 1, 2006, if the 6 applicant meets the qualifications under subdivisions (a)(1), (a)(2), and (a)(4) of this 7 section and pays the proper fee. Before the Board may issue a license, the applicant 8 must pass the examination under subsection (b) of this section after gaining the 9 experience required under subdivision (a)(3) of this section. 10 (h) Persons who had an established place of business prior to January 1, 2004, and who produce satisfactory evidence that they are engaged in the irrigation business 11 12 as defined in G.S. 89D-11 and were not registered as a landscape contractor under G.S. 89D-1 through G.S. 89D-10 or were not qualified to receive an irrigation contractor's 13 14 license on January 1, 2004, may apply for an irrigation contractor's provisional license 15 on or before July 1, 2004. The Board shall issue a provisional license, valid up to July 1, 2006, if the applicant meets the qualifications under subdivisions (a)(1), (a)(2), and 16 17 (a)(4) of this section and pays the proper fee. Before the Board may issue a license, the 18 applicant must pass the examination under subsection (b) of this section after gaining the experience required under subdivision (a)(3) of this section. 19 20 "§ 89D-17. Reciprocity. 21 The Board may issue a license, without examination, to any person who is a landscape contractor or irrigation contractor licensed, certified, or registered in another 22 23 state or country if the requirements for licensure, certification, or registration in the 24 other state or country are substantially equivalent to the requirements for licensure in 25 this State. "§ 89D-18. License renewal and continuing education. 26 Every license issued under this Chapter shall be renewed on or before the 27 (a) thirty-first day of December of each year. Any person who desires to continue to 28 29 practice shall apply for a license renewal and shall submit the required fee. When necessary, the Board may require licensees to demonstrate continued competence as a 30 condition of license renewal. Licenses that are not renewed shall be automatically 31 32 revoked. A license may be renewed at any time within one year after its expiration if: (i) the applicant pays the required renewal fee and late renewal fee; (ii) the Board finds that 33 the applicant has not used the license in a manner inconsistent with the provisions of 34 this Chapter or engaged in the practice of landscape construction or contracting or 35 irrigation construction or contracting after notice of revocation; and (iii) the applicant is 36 37 otherwise eligible for licensure under the provisions of this Chapter. 38 As a condition of license renewal, a licensee must meet the continuing (b) education requirements set by the Board. 8	actions for injunctive relief to prevent any person from violating the provisions of this
9	Chapter or the rules adopted by the Board.
10	(b) A licensed landscape contractor or licensed irrigation contractor shall notify
11	the Board, by registered mail, of any written complaints regarding a job related to
12	landscape or irrigation work filed against the landscape contractor or irrigation
13	contractor within 30 days from the date the complaint was filed."
14	SECTION 3. Any person already registered as a landscape contractor on
15	December 31, 2003, shall be issued a landscape contractor's license, without the
16	requirement of examination, upon submission of a completed application and payment
17	of the application fee on or before April 1, 2004. Landscape contractors registered
18	under Chapter 89D of the General Statutes shall not be required to renew the
19	registration for calendar year 2004 to qualify for the landscape contractor's license.
20	SECTION 4. Any person who has obtained a Certified Irrigation Contractor
21	(CIC) certification through the Carolinas Irrigation Association or who has obtained a
22	Certified Irrigation Designer (CID) certification on the effective date of this act shall be
23	issued an irrigation contractor's license, without the requirement of examination, upon
24	submission of a completed application and payment of the application fee on or before
25	April 1, 2004.
26	SECTION 5. Members serving on the North Carolina Landscape
27	Contractors' Registration Board on the effective date of this act shall continue to serve
28	until the North Carolina Landscape/Irrigation Contractors' Licensing Board is
29	appointed. All records, staff, funds, and other items of the North Carolina Landscape
30	Contractors' Registration Board are transferred to and made the property of the North
31	Carolina Landscape/Irrigation Contractors' Licensing Board.
32	SECTION 6. At its discretion, the Board may grant, without the requirement
33	of examination, an irrigation contractor's license to a registered landscape contractor or
34	a person who has obtained a Certified Landscape Irrigation Auditor (CLIA) certification
35	through the Carolinas Irrigation Association and has three years of experience in
36	irrigation contracting.
37	SECTION 7. This act becomes effective January 1, 2004.
