1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE NORTH CAROLINA CONSTITUTION TO GRANT
3	THE GOVERNOR A LINE-ITEM VETO OF APPROPRIATIONS ITEMS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. Section 9 of Article II of the North Carolina Constitution is
6	amended by adding a new subsection to read:
7	"(9) Vetoes of items in appropriations bills. If a bill contains any item or items of
8	appropriations, and the Governor does not return the entire bill with objections, the
9	Governor may disapprove any item or items of any appropriation bill embracing distinct
10	items, and the part or the parts of the bill approved shall be the law, and the item or
11	items disapproved shall be void, unless reconsidered and passed according to the rules
12	and limitations prescribed in this section for the passage of bills notwithstanding the
13	objections of the Governor. The return of such objections shall be in accordance with
14	the rules set out by this section for the return of entire bills. The Governor shall in
15	writing state specifically the item or items disapproved, setting the same out in full in
16	the message, together with the reasons for such objection. The enrolled bill shall not be
17	returned with the Governor's objection. If more than one item is objected to in a bill, the
18	General Assembly may reconsider the items separately or together.
19	As used in this subsection, "item" refers to a separable sum of money appropriated.
20	It does not refer separately to punctuation, letters, words, phrases, or sentences which
21	express purposes or conditions with reference to the appropriation made. The Governor
22	cannot object to the appropriation without also objecting to the condition or limitation.
23	Conversely, the Governor cannot veto the condition or limitation without also
24	disapproving the appropriation."
25	SECTION 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be
26	submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the next statewide election, primary or
27	otherwise, which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in

the State. Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 28

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of the General Statutes. The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall 1 2 be: 3 "[] FOR [] AGAINST 4 Constitutional amendment granting the Governor the line-item veto over appropriations items." 5 6 **SECTION 3.** If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the 7 amendment to the Secretary of State whereupon the amendment shall become effective. 8 9 The amendment shall apply to all bills ratified after that date. The Secretary of State 10 shall enroll the amendment so certified among the permanent records of that office. 11 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
