- (5) This limitation can best be overcome through use of high-speed 1 2 computer and telecommunications technology, combined with 3 customized software, that provides a practical and cost-effective means to convert electronic text-based information, including daily 4 5 newspapers, into synthetic speech suitable for statewide distribution 6 with modern telecommunications technology. 7 Low-cost interstate telecommunications rates make distribution of (6) 8 electronic text-based information to eligible users both efficient and 9 cost-effective for the State. 10 (7) Federal funds have been used to develop the technology and infrastructure needed for statewide toll-free access to daily newspapers 11 12 and other timely information of local, State, and national interest through a service known as NFB-NEWSLINE®, providing an efficient 13 14 and cost-effective means of reader registration, content acquisition, 15 and interstate telecommunications support. Use of this accessible electronic information service will enhance the 16 (8) 17 State's current efforts to meet the needs of blind and disabled citizens 18 for access to information that is otherwise available in print, thereby reducing isolation and supporting full integration and equal access for 19 these individuals. 20 21 (c) Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section: Accessible electronic information service. – A service where news and 22 (1) other timely information, including newspapers, is provided to eligible 23 24 individuals from a multistate service center, using high-speed computers and telecommunications technology for interstate 25 acquisition of content and rapid distribution in a form appropriate for 26 use by blind and disabled persons. 27 Blind and disabled persons. – Those individuals who are eligible for 28 (2) 29 library loan services through the Library of Congress and the State 30 Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 701.10(b). 31 32 Director. – The Director of the Division of Services for the Blind in (3) the Department of Health and Human Services. 33 Oualified entity. – An agency, instrumentality, or political subdivision 34 <u>(4)</u> 35 of the State or a nonprofit organization that: Provides interstate access for eligible persons to read daily 36 newspapers producing audio editions by computer. 37 38 Provides a means of program administration or reader b.
 - (d) Administration of Service. The Division of Services for the Blind shall administer the statewide accessible electronic information service, including its establishment, operation, and promotion. The Director of the Division of Services for the Blind shall enter into an agreement with a qualified entity to provide an accessible electronic information service for eligible blind and disabled persons. The Division of

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- Services for the Blind shall plan for continuation of the service from year to year and make maximum use of federal and other funds available by obtaining grant or in-kind support from appropriate programs and securing access to low-cost interstate rates for telecommunications by reimbursement or otherwise.
 - (e) Power to Regulate. The Commission shall have the same power to regulate the operation of the accessible electronic information service as it has to regulate any public utility subject to the provisions of this Chapter."
 - **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 2004-2005 fiscal year to be used by the Division of Services for the Blind to establish an accessible electronic information service for blind and disabled persons in this State.
 - **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
