Economic D for the 2004 North Carol	ECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Rural Development Center, Inc., the sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000) I-2005 fiscal year. The funds shall be used to establish and implement the fina Economic Infrastructure Program. The Program shall consist of the ur areas of investment:
•) To provide grants to local governments to construct critical water and wastewater facilities to sites where these facilities will generate private job-creating investment.
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(4 SI	 To promote the diversification of North Carolina small farm businesses into value-added production and marketing and to increase opportunities in food and beverage manufacturing and distribution for small farm entrepreneurs. ECTION 2. The Rural Economic Development Center, Inc., may contract

SECTION 2. The Rural Economic Development Center, Inc., may contract with other State agencies and constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina for certain aspects of the program, including design of program guidelines and evaluation of program results.

2	five percent (5%) of the funds appropriated by this act to cover its expenses in
3	administering the North Carolina Economic Infrastructure Program.

5	the Joint Legislative Committee on Governmental Operations on a quarterly basis
6	concerning the progress of the North Carolina Economic Infrastructure Program. It must
7	make its initial report on the program no later than January 15, 2005.
8	SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
