## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 2 AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF DURHAM TO 3 ADOPT ORDINANCES AND GUIDELINES CONCERNING PROTEST 4 PETITIONS. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Section 94.5 of the Charter of the City of Durham, being 6 7 Chapter 671 of the 1975 Session Laws, as amended, is further amended by placing the 8 letter (a) before the existing paragraph and adding a new subsection to read: 9 "(b) In addition to the authority given in G.S. 160A-386 to adopt ordinances 10 regarding the submission of protest petitions, the City may adopt ordinances and 11 guidelines to implement the provisions of G.S. 160A-385. Those ordinances and 12 guidelines may define the manner of calculating the number and configuration of the 13 sides of the tract(s) under consideration for rezoning, the method of calculating the area 14 eligible to protest under the 100-foot standard provided in G.S. 160A-385, and the manner and procedures by which signers must execute a protest petition and withdraw 15 16 their signatures on a protest petition. In addition, the City may adopt ordinances and 17 guidelines to allow proposed development plan rezoning to be treated in the same manner as proposed rezoning to special use or conditional use districts under 18 G.S. 160A-385, and to exclude from consideration as "opposite" lots those lots that are 19 20 separated from the tract(s) proposed for rezoning by designated State or federal multilane limited access highways." 21 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law. 22
