A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE JOINT 3 LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO MODIFY AND EXTEND THE PROVISION THAT PERMITS RETIRED TEACHERS TO 4 5 RETURN TO THE CLASSROOM WITHOUT A LOSS OF RETIREMENT 6 BENEFITS. 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 135-3(8)c. reads as rewritten: 8 9 "c. Should a beneficiary who retired on an early or service retirement allowance under this Chapter be reemployed, or 10 otherwise engaged to perform services, by an employer 11 12 participating in the Retirement System on a part-time, temporary, interim, or on a fee-for-service basis, whether 13 14 contractual or otherwise, and if such beneficiary earns an 15 amount during the 12-month period immediately following the effective date of retirement or in any calendar year which 16 exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the reported compensation, 17 excluding terminal payments, during the 12 months of service 18 preceding the effective date of retirement, or twenty thousand 19 dollars (\$20,000), whichever is greater, as hereinafter indexed, 20 then the retirement allowance shall be suspended as of the first 21 day of the month following the month in which the 22 reemployment earnings exceed the amount above, for the 23 balance of the calendar year. The retirement allowance of the 24 beneficiary shall be reinstated as of January 1 of each year 25 following suspension. The amount that may be earned before 26 suspension shall be increased on January 1 of each year by the 27

2	The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary

	a public school for at least six months immediately preceding

9	while the beneficiary is employed to teach as a teacher, a
10	guidance counselor, or a media coordinator on a substitute,
11	interim, or permanent basis in a public school. The Department
12	of Public Instruction shall certify to the Retirement System that
13	a beneficiary is employed to teach by a local school
14	administrative unit under the provisions of this sub-subdivision
15	and as a retired teacher educator as the term is defined under the
16	provisions of G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a).
17	Beneficiaries employed under this sub-subdivision are not
18	entitled to any benefits otherwise provided under this Chapter
19	as a result of this period of employment."
20	SECTION 2. G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) reads as rewritten:
21	"(5a) "Retired teacher" educator" means a beneficiary of the Teachers' and
22	State Employees' Retirement System of North Carolina who has been
23	retired at least six months, has not been employed in any capacity,
24	other than as a substitute teacher or a part-time tutor, with a local
25	board of education for at least six months, immediately preceding the
26	effective date of reemployment, is determined by a local board of
27	education to have had satisfactory performance during the last year of
28	employment by a local board of education, and who is employed to
29	teach as provided in G.S. 135-3(8)c. A retired teacher educator who is
30	<u>a teacher</u> shall be treated the same as a probationary teacher except
31	that (i) a retired teacher is not eligible for career status and (ii) the
32	performance of a retired teacher who had attained career status prior to
33	retirement shall be evaluated in accordance with a local board of
34	education's policies and procedures applicable to career teachers."
35	SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-316(d) reads as rewritten:
36	"(d) A local board of education may pay a retired teacher, educator, as that term is
37	defined in G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) no more than the employee would have received on the
38	teacher appropriate salary schedule, excluding longevity, had the employee not retired."
39	SECTION 4 . Subsection (d) of Section 28.24 of S.L. 1998-212, as rewritten
40	by Section 28.10 of S.L. 2002-126, reads as rewritten:
41	"(d) This section becomes effective January 1, 1999, and expires June 30, 2004.

10	30, 2004.<u>2010.</u>"
11	SECTION 8. This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
