## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO WINSTON-SALEM DELTA FINE ARTS, INC.

Whereas, Winston-Salem Delta Fine Arts, Inc., is an independent nonprofit, cultural, and educational corporation that was established in August 1972; and

Whereas, the Delta Arts Center of Winston-Salem Delta Fine Arts, Inc. was established in 1982 and is Winston-Salem's oldest incorporated, nonprofit cultural and educational organization established and operated by a community-based organization of African-American women; and

Whereas, members of the community of Winston-Salem and surrounding areas are involved in Delta Arts Center activities, as board members, volunteers, visitors, and program participants; and

Whereas, in 2003, Delta Fine Arts completed 31 years of providing unique cultural and educational experiences through a year-round program of exhibitions, classes, workshops, lectures, films, performances, and special projects for children, adults, and the elderly in the areas of visual arts, music, literature, history, and folk arts; and

Whereas, since 1972, Delta Fine Arts has made significant donations to North Carolina collections of art by African-Americans and has brought the work of master and nationally recognized African-American artists to this State; and

Whereas, Delta Fine Arts has enhanced the permanent art collection of Winston-Salem State University through the purchases of paintings by North Carolina native artists John Biggers, Romare Bearden, Samuel Brown, Stephanie Pogue, and of sculptures by William Artis and Selma Burke; and

Whereas, Delta Fine Arts has also brought to this State visual and historical exhibitions, readings by African-American authors, and musical performances of works by African-American composers, including Pulitzer prize-winning authors such as Gwendolyn Brooks, Rita Dove, and Alice Walker and Pulitzer prize-winning composer George Walker; and

**SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to Winston-Salem Delta Fine Arts, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) for the 2004-2005 fiscal year to complete the building renovations of the organization's Delta Arts Center.

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
