A BILL TO BE ENTITLED **INCREASE** AN ACT TO THE EXCISE TAX ON **CIGARETTES** AS RECOMMENDED BY THE LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMISSION ON YOUTH AND TO MAKE OTHER **TECHNICAL** CHILDREN AND CORRECTIONS.

Whereas, tobacco use continues to be a major health concern among youth in this State; and

Whereas, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, raising the price of a pack of cigarettes, through a tax, is the most effective way to prevent youth from smoking; and

Whereas, North Carolina's cigarette tax is the second lowest in the nation; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 105-113.5 reads as rewritten:

"§ 105-113.5. Tax on cigarettes.

A tax is levied on the sale or possession for sale in this State, by a distributor, of all cigarettes at the rate of two and one half mills three and three-quarter cents (3.75ϕ) per individual cigarette.

This tax does not apply to any of the following:

- (1) Sample cigarettes distributed without charge in packages containing five or fewer cigarettes.
- (2) Cigarettes in a package of cigarettes given without charge by the manufacturer of the cigarettes to an employee of the manufacturer who works in a factory where cigarettes are made, if the cigarettes are not taxed by the federal government."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
