A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE FOOD BANKS IN NORTH
2 CAROLINA.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
6 Department of Health and Human Services the sum of one million five hundred
7 thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) for the 2004-2005 fiscal year for the State Nutrition
8 Assistance Program (SNAP). These funds shall be allocated equally among the
9 following North Carolina food banks:

- 10 (1) Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina (Charlotte).
- 11 (2) The Food Bank of North Carolina (Raleigh, Durham, Greenville,
12 Southern Pines, and Wilmington).
- 13 (3) The Food Bank of the Albemarle (Elizabeth City).
- 14 (4) MANNA Food Bank (Asheville).
- 15 (5) Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest North Carolina
16 (Winston-Salem).
- 17 (6) The Second Harvest Food Bank of Southeastern North Carolina
18 (Fayetteville).

19 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
20 Department of Health and Human Services the sum of five hundred thousand dollars
21 (\$500,000) for the 2004-2005 fiscal year. These funds shall be allocated equally among
22 the following for operating expenses:

- 23 (1) Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina (Charlotte).
- 24 (2) The Food Bank of North Carolina (Raleigh, Durham, Greenville,
25 Southern Pines, and Wilmington).
- 26 (3) The Food Bank of the Albemarle (Elizabeth City).
- 27 (4) MANNA Food Bank (Asheville).

- 1 (5) Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest North Carolina
2 (Winston-Salem).
3 (6) The Second Harvest Food Bank of Southeastern North Carolina
4 (Fayetteville).
5 (7) Community Food Kitchen (Charlotte).
6 (8) InterFaith Food Shuttle (Raleigh).
7 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
