4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	SECTION 1.(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 12 of Chapter		
6	160A of the Go	eneral Statutes, the following procedures may be utilized by the City of	
7	Goldsboro relat	ive to the sale of surplus real property.	
8	SEC	TION 1.(b) Substandard surplus real property may be disposed of under	
9	the following p	rocedures:	
10	(1)	The City Clerk will notify the Planning and Community Development	
11		Department of receipt of substandard surplus property.	
12	(2)	The Planning and Community Development Department will identify	
13		all contiguous property owners.	
14	(3)	The Planning and Community Development Department will	
15		determine if any of the adjoining parcels are substandard.	
16	(4)	If only one of the adjacent lots is substandard, the owner of that lot	
17		will be deeded the City's surplus lot if the owner so desires.	
18	(5)	If more than one adjoining parcel to the surplus property is	
19		substandard, the Planning and Community Development Department	
20		will contact these property owners to determine their interest in	
21		receiving the substandard lot. If more than one adjoining property	
22		owner expresses interest in the substandard lot, the property will be	
23		divided in order to create two standard adjoining lots.	
24	(6)	If dividing the substandard lot among adjoining property owners does	
25		not create two standard lots, ownership of the entire lot will be	

- (6) If dividing the substandard lot among adjoining property owners does not create two standard lots, ownership of the entire lot will be awarded to the highest contiguous bidder as a result of a sealed bid process.
- (7) If the property adjacent to a substandard lot is standard in nature, the property will be divided among the adjoining property owners. If only

1		one adjoining standard property owner shows interest in the standard	
2		lot, full property ownership will be awarded to this owner.	
3	SEC'	FION 1.(c) Standard surplus real property may be disposed of under the	
4	following procedures:		
5	(1)	The City Clerk will notify the Planning and Community Development	
6		Department of receipt of standard real surplus property.	
7	(2)	The Planning and Community Development Department will identify	
8		all contiguous property owners.	
9	(3)	The Planning and Community Development Department will	
10		determine if any of the adjoining parcels are substandard.	
11	(4)	If a substandard lot adjoins a standard City surplus lot and the property	
12		owner is willing to pay fifty percent (50%) of the tax value of the	
13		surplus lot, this lot will be sold to the owner of the substandard lot at	
14		this price without further attempt to secure bidders.	
15	(5)	If more than one adjoining property is substandard and both property	
16		owners are willing to share the minimum asking price of fifty percent	
17		(50%) of the total property tax value, the lot in question will then be	
18		subdivided between the two adjoining property owners of substandard	
19		lots without soliciting further bids.	
20	(6)	When all adjacent lots are standard in nature, the Finance Department	
21		will conduct the sale of the standard surplus lot. Standard surplus lots	
22		will be offered for sale under the "Negotiated Offer, Advertisement	
23		and Upset Bid" procedure. The minimum sale price will be set at fifty	
24		percent (50%) of the property's tax value.	
25	SEC	FION 2. When selling standard properties, the City of Goldsboro will at	
26	a minimum:		
27	(1)	Notify the adjacent property owners of persons who have bid on	
28		surplus property in the past and real estate firms.	
29	(2)	A "For Sale" sign will be placed upon the property and a nonlegal	
30		advertisement will be printed in the local newspaper. Public service	
31		advertisements will be broadcast on local radio and cable television.	
32		Information will also be placed on the City of Goldsboro's on-hold	
33		telephone message recording and on the City's Web site.	
34	SEC'	FION 3. The City of Goldsboro will contact the County of Wayne for	
35	their concurrence prior to beginning the sale of substandard and standard lots jointly		
36	owned by both governmental entities.		
37	•	TION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
