May 27, 2004 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO WAKEMED HEALTH & HOSPITALS, INC., FOR PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE WAKEMED **BIOMEDICAL ALLIANCE.** Whereas, WakeMed Health & Hospitals, Inc., is a multihospital, private, nonprofit teaching and tertiary health care system based in Wake County; and Whereas, WakeMed's emergency departments handled more than 147,000 visits in 2003; and Whereas, WakeMed's heart program leads the State in number of procedures; and Whereas, WakeMed is virtually the sole provider in Wake County of hospital services for the medically underserved population; and Whereas, WakeMed's annual contribution in free care is over \$68,000,000 in addition to bad debt and what is written off for contractual adjustments for Medicare and Medicaid: and Whereas, with over 6,000 employees, WakeMed is the third largest private employer in the Research Triangle Area; and Whereas, WakeMed's medical staff includes nearly 900 physicians, representing all medical and surgical specialties, and is the largest off-site teaching program for UNC-Chapel Hill; and Whereas, WakeMed is positioned to expand services and stimulate economic growth in health care delivery, information technology, and biomedical research and development; and Whereas, the WakeMed Biomedical Alliance will support biomedical research by accelerating the migration of innovative ideas, products, and devices into health care settings; and Whereas, WakeMed Biomedical Alliance will align itself with university systems, the business community, and government entities; and

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to WakeMed
Health & Hospitals, Inc., the sum of four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) for the
