4 5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 163-182.15 reads as rewritten:		
6	"§ 163-182.15. Certificate of nomination or election, or certificate of the results of		
7	a referendum.		
8	(a) Issued by County Board of Elections. – In ballot items within the jurisdiction		
9	of the county board of elections, the county board shall issue a certificate of nomination		
10	or election, or a certificate of the results of the referendum, as appropriate. The		
11	certificate shall be issued by the county board five days after the completion of the		
12 13	canvass pursuant to G.S. 163-182.5, unless there is an election protest pending. If there		
13 14	is an election protest, the certificate of nomination or election or the certificate of the result of the referendum shall be issued in one of the following ways, as appropriate:
