7	SECTION 1. G.S. 135-3(8) is amended by adding a new sub-subdivision to

9	"c1. The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary

11	retired at least three months and has not been employed in any

under sub-subdivision c. of this subdivision who has been retired at least three months and has not been employed in any capacity with the Department of Transportation for at least three months immediately preceding the effective date of reemployment, shall not include earnings while the beneficiary is employed with the Department of Transportation as an engineer or engineering technician. The Department of Transportation shall certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed by the Department of Transportation as a retired engineer or retired engineering technician.

A 'retired engineer' or 'retired engineering technician' means a beneficiary of the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System of the State of North Carolina who has been retired at least three months, has not been employed in any capacity by the Department of Transportation for at least three months immediately preceding the effective date of reemployment, is determined by the Department of Transportation to have had satisfactory performance during the last year of employment,

1	and who is employed as an engineer or engineering technician.
2	A retired engineer or engineering technician shall be treated the
3	same as a probationary employee except that a retired engineer
4	or engineering technician is not eligible for career status.
5	Beneficiaries employed under this sub-subdivision are not entitled to any benefits
6	otherwise provided under this Chapter as a result of this period of employment."
7	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
